



Washington, April 2.—Representative Flood, of New York, to day introduced in the House a bill reciting that the Dominion of Canada Customs Act of 1879, providing for the admission free of duty into Canada of certain articles which may be admitted The Manitoba Government has re- free into the United States has not ceived a loan from the Winnipeg sink- been carried out. It then provides for the following schedule of duties:

Eggs, 5 cents per dozen. Apples, 40 cents per barrel; blackberries, gooseberries, raspberries and strawberries, 4 cents per pound, peaches 1 cent per pound; cherries and currants, I cent per quart; cranberries, plums and quinces, 30 cents per bushel; grapes ten cents per pound.
