Belleville water has been pronounced pure by Analyst McFarlane.

Kingston will enlarge its gas works and furnish gas for cooking purposes.

Cattle men near Battleford say the stock have wintered very successfully.

The average value of the ore being taken from the Richardson gold mine is \$23 a ton.

Fifty-three immigrant children arrived at the Marchmont Home, Belleville, Wednesday from England.

Gilbert, who assaulted Ernest Blake at Paris, has been convicted of assault with attempt to kill at the Brantford assizes.

An ice jam near the railroad bridge of Belleville on Monday night week, caused some fears of a flood, but so far no damage has occurred.

Dr. Sauche, a young physician of Ste. Therese, Terrebonne County, accidentally poisoned himself with an overdose of opium on Sunday.

Henry Cook, of Burgessville, near Woodstock, was badly crushed by a bent beam on him Wednesday, while putting down an old barn.

A consignment of 150 boys from the Southwick Home, London, England, passed through Smith's Falls Thursday, bound for Toronto.

Montreal City Council having decided to make an increase in the corporation's tax, the city engineer deplores the measure, which will have no effect on improvements.

Rev. Canon Norman, of Montreal, was yesterday presented with a handsome tea service on the occasion of his departure to assume the rectorship of Quebec.

Ex-Senator Hamilton, of Montreal, died suddenly Thursday night from the effects of a stroke of paralysis. He leaves an estate of over half a million dollars.

The railway subsidy bill in the New Brunswick Legislature is proving a source of trouble to Premier Blair, and disappointed supporters are loudly complaining.

The Manitoba Government has received a loan from the Winnipeg sinking fund sufficient for the immediate purposes of construction of the Red River Valley Railroad.

There are some mighty mean men in this world. One of them has invented a contribution box which registers the amount each person puts in, so that the whole congregation can see it.

The Builders' and Contractors' Exchange of Hamilton have decided to continue the lockout unless a settlement to last all season is reached in every branch of the building trade.

Editor Hawke, of the Moncton Transcript, who is charged with contempt of court on account of recent comments on the bench, will undertake to prove that Judge Fraser was drunk in court.

Mr. J. W. Smoke, of Burlington Plains, and his sister, while driving along Main street, Hamilton, Wednesday, were thrown out of their buggy by a collision with a horse reel. No serious results are expected.

A man named LaSalle, who claims to have been a Roman Catholic priest, and is now lecturing at Kingston, is charged by Father Davis of that city with being an impostor.

An examination of the ship Vancouver, reported as having put back into St. John, B. N., because the crew refused to do their duty, showed her to be seaworthy. Fourteen of the sailors go to jail for twelve weeks for this act of mutiny.

Wm. Risk, an Alvington business man, was last week, at the Sarnia Assizes, sentenced to three years in the penitentiary for perjury. He had made an affidavit in a Division Court suit at Alvington that he had paid certain witness fees, which was not the fact.

Judgment is reserved in the action brought by Ald. Stevenson, of Montreal, against Mr. Ronald, a steam engine manufacturer of Chatham, Ont., for \$3,000 damages for slander. The latter was desirous of selling Montreal a fire engine, and charged that Stevenson had taken money to support another machine.

W. J. Currio of Strathroy, was committed for trial by Squire Mobile at Strathroy last Thursday on the charge of having committed perjury in taking an oath at a polling place in Adelaide during the recent West Middlesex election, that he had resided with his father during the six months previously, whereas evidence was forthcoming to show that he had not lived at home for nearly two years. He was admitted to bail in \$200 and two securities of \$200 each.
