FIRE, A very disistrous fire occurred at the GTR yard early Wednesday morning last. About four o'clock the brigade were alarmed and were quickly upon the spot, but the fire h d es rates. got much headway in two buildings and the efforts of the Company were devoted to the adjoining building and easy terms. the overhead bridge, which were saved. The fire originated in the plaster storehouse belonging to the Grand River Plaster Co., from some unknown cause, and spread regidly to Messre J & E Baxter's grain elevator, which contained nearly eight thousand bushels of grain, principally wheat, which is rendered useless, except for very coarse feed. Searcely a vestige of either building remains: immense piles of CAPITAL (PAID UP) smoking wheat and soaked plaster are REST, the only traces of the two structures. We think the grain was covered by insurance but no policy w s held on the elevator. The Plaster Co., were insured, but we do not know the amount.
