### Two Fires at Simcoe.

THE TOWN COUNCIL OFFERS A REWARD OF \$1,000 FOR THE CONVICTION OF THE FIREBUG.

SIMCOE, Nov. 27.—About half past nine o'clock last night a fire broke out in a large warehouse, situated in the station yards of the Air Line division of the Grand Trunk here. The building was a frame structure and belonged to Alex. McCall. It was leased by Marshall & Son, grain buyers. When discovered the flames were in complete possession and its total demolition could not be prevented. Several cars which stood along side of it partially loaded were pulled out of harm's way. The building was valued at \$1,000 and was insured for \$500. The warehouse usually at this season of the year contains from \$15,000 to \$20,000 worth of grain, but luckily Marshall & Son had been shipping barley lately and they had on hand only about 4,000 bushels, all of which would have been shipped in another day had not the fire occurred. The loss is about \$2,200, on which they had an insurance of \$1,000. It is not definitely known what started the fire, but it is thought to have originated from careless dropping of a match by some grain thieves.

SIMCOE, Ont., Nov. 28.—Early this morning Wm. Sutton's large flour mills were discovered to be in flames, and the circumstances surrounding the affair leave no doubt as to the incendiary origin of the fire. All the heavy running machinery in the basement of the mill was saved, but the upper part was destroyed. The mill was worth about \$10,000. There was an insurance of \$5,000 on it in the Millers' and Manufacturers' company. In addition to the loss on the mill, there was stored in the building between 6,000 and 7,000 bushels of wheat and a quantity of other grain. Mr. Sutton estimates his loss to be at least \$8,000 on the grain, which has an insurance of \$3,000. A special meeting of the town council was held this afternoon, at which a reward of \$1,000 was authorized to be offered for the conviction of the firebug.
