The Walsingham Tragedy.

Dr. Phelan, coroner, of Walsingham Centre; held an inquest on Wednesday of l st week in the case of young Rohrer, who was shot by a boy named Davis, in Walsingham. Dr. J. M. Tweedale made a post mortem, and the county crown attorney, J. H. Ansley, of Simcoe, attended on behalf of the crown. It was shown in evidence that Davis and Robrer were together on the 8th concession of Walsingham. Davis had a revolver and they went after a squirrel. Davis fired the revolver three times, and then Rohres asked to be allowed to try it. Rohrer pulled the trigger, but the weapon missed fire. Davis then tried it and it again missed fire. Thinking the revolver no longer dangerous, Davis turned it upon Rohrer, saying, "look out; I'll shoot you." He pulled the trigger and the cartridge exploded, the b. II entering Rohrer's temple near the right eye. The verdict of the jury is: "That gun wound infflicted by Ernest Davis. Davis was committed to jail to stand his trial. 
