Dublin, June 12.—A train containing an excursson party from Armagh has been wrecked near that place. The train contained 1,200 persons, composed

of Methodist Sunday school scholars, their teachers, and relatives. They were going on an excursion to Warren point. Seventy bodies have been taken from the wreck. There are others buried under the debris. Warren point, the place where the party was bound, is a watering place at the mouth of the Newry river in county Down. Over a hundred of the passengers were injured.
