CHEATED HIMSELF OUT OF \$11,000-The report of the special auditor appointed by the Essex county council to Treasurer Wright's books, shows that the township owes Mr. Wright \$11,272. Year after year Mr. Wright found a deficit in his books which he couldn't account for, and he was compelled to sell nearly \$10,000 worth of property at different times to make this good. He at length asked for a special audit, and this showed that he had, by his bad book keeping, cheated himself out of more than \$11,000. The county council are at a quandary how to raise funds to repay the treasurer.
