### John Scissors.

Twelve men have been in Windsor within the last few days enquiring for their runaway wives.

H. H. Warner, of Rochester, has sold his safe cure interests to an English syndicate for \$5,000,000.

The provisional directors of the Avlmer and Port Burwell railway have applied for a charter.
