James Douglas, the victim of Constable Hawkins' chance shot, took place at Streetsville this afternoon, the body having been taken there vesterday afternoon by John Douglas, the brother of the dead man.

The coroner's jury in the shooting case met again to-night. After taking the evidence of several pawnbrokers whom the deceased tried to buy a revolver, fhe jury asked the coroner to have the doctors of the asylum in which Douglas had been confined called to testify as to the mental condition. The inquest then adjourned until Tuesday, Oct. 8.
