Manitoulin Island.
To the Editor of the Jarvis Record:
We have had beautiful sleighing from Jan'y 1st to April 3rd; neither thaws nor drifts to spoil the roads. Myself and wife lately took a drive with horse and cutter to Kagawong via Lake Minde-moya, West Bay, Indian village and Hononara Bay. A description of the pleasant nature of a drive of this kind is beyond my power; gliding swiftly over the smooth ice around one point and then another along the ever varied shore some places rising hundreds of feet above you with plenty of room for all the fast horses of Haldimand and Norfolk side by side with such glorious opportunities to make a dash for the lead. The sun shining brightly on the crisp ice and snow of d hills. Met with Mr. Hugh Bothwell and a number of other old friends from Walpele and Woodhouse at Kagawong. The sons of G. N. Buck are preparing nets for a more extensive prosecution of the fishing business. The firm of Beam Bros. of the city of Buffalo will move two large rafts of cedar from the south of the island when navigation opens. Mr. J. S. Beemer of the above firm made us a pleasant visit lately, he being an old acquaintance and relative.
The survey of the Manitoulin and North Shore R. R. is now completed and pronounced a line easy of construction. A grant of \$3,500 per mile is made by the Ontario Government. A demand will be made at Ottawa for a like amount with good assurance of success.
Little Current is incorporated as a town. Gore Bay is preparing to do likewise. They are each of them lively go-ahead places. Manitowaning and Providence Bay each show life and progress, and business in each has been good during the winter.
The firm of Berry Bros. have erected a large factory at Providence Bay and the same has been run to its utmost capacity all winter supplying shingles, doors, and all kinds of house furnishings in compliance with the home demand, an evidence that improved buildings are in progress.
The firm of R. W. Matchmor & Sons of this place have taken out a larger stock of pine than ever. Their wholesale shipment of pine will cease in a year or two more, however, and it is likely the old gentleman will then return to his many friends in Haldimand assured that if his farm property in this county will not support him in his declining years his handsome fortune acquired on the Manitoulin will not fail to do so.
We must not omit to mention that at various times your correspondent has met with our mutual friends, John McCall, James Gordon, James McFarlane, and last but not least, D. McGillvary, who is recognized as a busy man on the Island.
