Millionaire Jay Gould is after a \$5,000,000 castle in Mexico.

Lawson's oil works, London East, were totally destroyed by fire Monday.

Walter Powell, a G. T. R. passenger conductor, was killed at York station Monday.

James Lane, a Rosbank, Man., farmer, was killed by lightning on Saturday.

Mal Bratt, a St. Catharines man, was drowned at Burlington Beach on Saturday while bathing.

There are 500 American doctors at the international medical congress now in session at Berlin.

Joseph Rollin, a 16-year-old boy fell over the cliff at Major's hill, Ottawa, Monday, and was killed.

The manufacturers of Galt and Preston will send exhibits to the Jamaica exhibition, to be held in January next.

It is announced by the Russian newspapers that transportation to Siberia will shortly be abolished as a judicial punishment.

Secured, the wife murderer who is now in Sing Sing awaiting execution by electricity, is said to have become sincerely penitent.

A gang of counterfeiters who have been flooding Austria and Hungary with spurious florins and kreutzers have been captured at Prague.

Rachel Cates and William Cliburn, negroes, were hanged at Lancaster Court House, S. C., on Friday for the murder of August Henkel.

A strong crusade is about to be commenced in Montreal against tax exemptions. The amount of exempted property there is \$19,752,210.

Joseph Legue, an engineer, fell from the tower of Notre Dame cathedral, Montreal, Monday, a distance of 160 feet and was instantly killed.

Valuable phosphate leads in the Wakefield district, about twenty miles from Ottawa, have just been discovered by a Californian miner named Dollar.

Several gentlemen in Brantford are agitating for a Saturday night train service to Port Dover. Leaving Brantford at 8.05 the train would arrive at the Port about 10.

Farmers in western Ontario pronounce the growth of the two-rowed barley seed imported from England by the Dominion Government a grand success.

Manitoba farmers are now in the midst of wheat cutting. One farmer at Wapella, named McDonald, in his hurry fell off his wagon and broke his neck on Saturday.

Sunday afternoon Charles McCaffrey, the Canadian bridge jumper, jumped from the Shears at the Atlantic works, East Boston, a distance of 150 feet. He was killed.

A despatch from Wheeling, W. Va., states that the Baltimore and Ohio railway bridge across the Dignarts Valley river at Grafton fell Sunday morning with a train of fourteen cars.

Reliable information shows that a crop of 17,000,000 bushels of wheat will be secured in the North-west this year, and of this quantity the amount exported will probably reach 12,000,000 bushels.

Fifteen hundred Icelanders celebrated their national holiday at Winnipeg on Saturday. The orators of the day expressed their greatest satisfaction with the change from Iceland to Manitoba.

The remains of the late Captain John Ericsson will be placed on board the United States SS. Baltimore at New York on August 23, and transported to his native country, Sweden. This act on the part of the United States is a tribute to the memory of the great Swedish inventor.

The report as to the great distress

among the settlers in western Dakota has been fully confirmed. Many of the distressed people propose crossing the border into the fertile Canadian North-West.

A Tucson, Ariz., despatch says: The rainfall in this section during the last three days has been unprecedented. All the streams are flooded, and much destruction of property has taken place in the valley.

The German emperor was cordially greeted at Ostend on Saturday. His majesty held a long conference with King Leopold, during which many matters of interest to the student of European politics were discussed.

An exchange says: "We knew it. For years we have been boiling the drinking water with the positive assurance that it was the surest way to rid it of its impurities. And now comes a physician who writes in the annals of hygiene that while boiling kills the germs of a certain disease it yet, in reality, renders the water more impure than it was before, because by the very death of these germs dead organic matter is allowed to remain in the water, which is polluted by putrefaction. What a blessed thing it would be if doctors would only decide to know what they do know."

"There is not one man or woman in 10,000 who can afford to do without seven or eight hours sleep," says T. De Wit Talmage in The Ladies Home Journal. "If you can get to bed early (then rise early)," he says. "If you cannot get to bed until late then rise late." It may be as Christian for one man to rise at 8 as it is for another to get up at 5. I counsel my readers to get up when they are rested. But let the rousing bell be rung at least 30 minutes before your public appearance. Physicians say that a sudden jump out of bed gives irregular motion to the pulse. It takes hours to get over a too sudden rising. Give us time after you call us to roll over, gaze at the world full in the face, and look before we leap."
