WALPOLE TOWN HALL,
Aug. 4th, 1890.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment, the members all present.
The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

Moved by Mr. Winger, seconded by Mr. Smith, that the account of A. & D. Fleming, dated May 20th, be laid over until further information is received.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stonehouse, seconded by Mr. Smith, that this council refund to Isabella Cummings the sum of \$1.50 the amount paid by her for Statute Labor.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Winger, and resolved that Mr. Clark be appointed to examine the bridge on Stage Road over Stoney Creek and repair the same.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Clark, that the following statement rendered by Mr. Stadler, a commissioner for expending that part of the grant to the village of Jarvis to be used on Main street, be accepted:
