The census taken in Berlin show the city has a population of 1,574,485.

The Bank of England has reduced its rate of discount from 6 to 5 per cent.

The petition against the return of Dr. Gilmore, M. P. P. for West York, has been dismissed.

The Kingston cotton mill has been sold to the eastern syndicate, and will change hands January 1.

Canadian barley, eggs and other produce are attracting increased attention in England.

A shell exploded in the admiralty powder magazine at Gosport Friday, killing one man and injuring two others.

It is said to be improbable that further legislation providing for silver coinage will be enacted at the present session of Congress.

The U. S. treasury department has decided that the bondsmen of the famous painting, The Angelus, are liable for \$16,500 duty upon it.

The U. S. Senate has pushed through the joint resolution authorizing the issuing of arms to the states of North and South Dakota.

Mr. David Cunningham, instructor in masonry at the Kingston Penitentiary, was killed Friday by a wheelbarrow falling on him.

John Shannon, who was charged with shooting George Damm in East Zorra, has been acquitted by the Woodstock police magistrates.

Mr. Thos. P. Blain of Niagara has been appointed to the governorship of Lincoln County, made vacant by the death of Gaolet Hamilton.

Ten thousand dollars worth of diamonds, the property of Mrs. Kirk B. Armour, have been stolen from the vault of the safe deposit company at Kansas City.

Joseph B. Abbott, confidential clerk of H. W. Sage & Co., lumbermen of Albany, suicided Wednesday night with laudanum. He is said to be a defaulter for over \$30,000.

Drs. Behring and Kitasato, of Berlin, have been experimenting with Prof. Koch's lymph in cases of diphtheria and tetanus, and have demonstrated the value of his discovery in those diseases.

The Chicago and Alton passenger train for Kansas City, was wrecked at Jacksonville Friday morning. Fred Smith, a merchant of Pekin, Ill., and James Piffet, of Fountain Place, Ill., were instantly killed; six persons were more or less injured.

Ross and McKay, two men who have been informing on Halifax liquor dealers for violating the law, and getting them fined by wholesale, were arrested Thursday on a charge of conspiracy. They violently resisted arrest and had to be handcuffed. They are charged with conspiring to induce a hotelkeeper to sell them liquor contrary to law, and it is alleged in the information that J. S. Potter, manager of the Sailors' Home, and others, were implicated in the conspiracy.
