



#### Our Poultry and Eggs.

The following are extracts from the report made by Mr. John Sanders, of Kemptsville, Ont., in regard to egg and poultry shipments to Great Britain. It will be printed and issued by the Finance Department, in the form of a bulletin, in the course of a few days: A GOOD MARKET FOR TURKEYS.

#### Early Lambs for Market.

In the rearing of early lambs the greatest difficulty that meets the shepherd is the trouble that arises over weakly lambs. If, however, the ewes have been given proper care, and have kept in good thriving condition, there is seldom much trouble with the lambs. The lambing folds must be comfortable dry and moderately warm. Unless the late February or early march fail to affect the lambs, there is but little hope in having them on the market in such condition as to command the best prices. In attending weak lambs it is best to never take the lamb away from the ewe as great difficulty will oftentimes arise in persuading her to own it again. The ewes should be fed well and given every care. It is advisable to shear
