To the Editor of the JARVIS RECORD:
Your correspondent could always heretofore truthfully praise the spring, fall and winter seasons on the Manitoulin. This spring, however, has been wet, cold and backward and many farmers on low lands had much difficulty in getting seeding done as early as desirable. Crops notwithstanding, are looking well and at this date, we have beautiful summer weather.
During our six years sojourn on the Manitoulin we have been cheered occasionally by the visits of old friends from Haldimand, Norfolk and Welland counties; but the faithful weekly visits of the RECORD takes precedence of them all, some part of its columns never failing to afford us news of the doings public and private of old friends. Long may it prosper and meet with the encouragement it deserves.
Since leaving Haldimand, although highly interested in all your public doings, I have never ventured as I formerly did to take any part therein. You will please permit me, however, to say I regret deeply the unenviable fame Haldimand has attained as regards Dominion election matters by which two young men of high promise have been as I am informed financially ruined. Every honest intelligent man will admit that party zeal even when legitimately exercised has been carried too far in the past, still worse when bribery is tolerated. Let us hope the time is not far distant when "All men's good will be each man's rule." Our country and our God first. Party nowhere! I used formerly to think that my reform friends were of a truth more than Conservatives blind followers of party. But I must admit that the Reformers of the Manitoulin have undecieved me and taught both parties a lesson which they would do well to heed in the future.
I will not attempt to detail here their reasons for refusing to support R. A. Lyons, the ministerial candidate suffice it to say they believed they had good and sufficient reasons. Hence they came out boldly and supported the opposition candidate, not being afraid to do what they thought right let it please whom it may. It is a fact that no great interest was taken in the contest by Conservatives, a large number of whom remained at home, at least in this locality, hence it was more a reform than a tory victory.

The population of Omaha is 134,742. Mr. Parnell was 44 years old on Saturday.

Eight persons have died at Louisville, Ky., from prostration.

Work on the T. H. & B. Railway will be commenced at once.

Census Supervisor Gilbert estimates Chicago's population at 1,085,000.

Seven cases of heat prostration were reported in Cincinnati on Friday.

The German army bill has passed to its third reading without amendment.

The first road on the Toronto, Hamilton & Buffalo railway was turned Saturday at Hamilton.

William Johnstone, aged 30, was drowned near Delaware, Ont., yesterday morning while bathing.

A Washington despatch says the population of the United States is about 64,500,000, against 50,155,783 in 1880.

The store of Joseph Wills at Fort Erie was burglarized on Friday night and considerable goods carried off.

The remains of the late Lieut. Governor McLelan, of Nova Scotia, were interred at Great Village on Saturday.

The official count of the population of the district of Columbia is 229,796, a gain in ten years of something over 52,000.

The Shawnee Indians in Indian territory have signed the treaty. They receive land in severalty and \$65,000—\$100 per capita.

Alarming reports have reached New Orleans regarding a general arming of negroes in one section of Louisiana for the purpose of waging a race conflict. Some shooting has taken place.

Boys are again reminded that they should not rob the nests of birds that destroy grubs, flies and insects, and most of those that fly about the neighborhood belongs to this class. "Bird nesting," as it is called, is a cruel practice, and boys known to indulge in it should be reprimanded. Hawks, crows, sparrows and some others may be killed, but the destruction of insect eating birds and their nests is an offence which may be punished before any magistrate.

Boys are not the only ones, however, who are guilty of destroying the songsters, as many young men, old enough to know better, arm themselves with guns and shoot every bird that comes within range. While in some localities, fortunately very few, young ladies have adopted the fad of collecting birds eggs. These individuals may not be aware that they may be fined the sum of \$20 for their so-called fun. But this is the case, and persons caught at it should be handed over to the authorities to be dealt with.

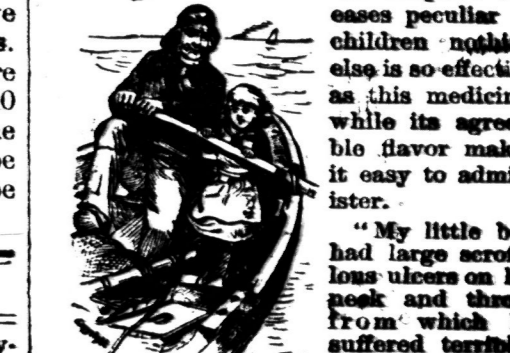
