CURRENT NOTES.

The Prohibitionists of Maine have just held a State convention which is noteworthy for its frank confession of the fact that prohibition does not prohibit in Maine. The platform contains the following statement:—"That the Republican and Democratic parties each contain a liquor element sufficiently large to prevent any thorough or determined enforcement of the prohibitory law; their declarations are therefore meaningless, and adoptions well understood by the liquor interest, and by the officials upon whom enforcement depends, and at whose hands 'the law is practically nullified in the cities and large towns in Maine.' This is precisely what the opponents of prohibition have always contended to be the truth, and now that its advocates conceded the fact there is no room for further argument on the question.

The judicial error of which the man named Borras, now liberated, was the victim in France, has brought to the front an old custom in the courts of Venice. There, when a prisoner is about to be condemned to death, a tall and ghostly-looking individual, dressed in a long black gown, walks majestically to the centre of the court room, bows solemnly to the Judges, and in a cavernous voice pronounces the not over-startling words:—"Remember the baker!" Then he bows again and stalks away. Just three hundred years ago a baker was executed in Venice for a crime of which he was not guilty. When his innocence was fully established, the Judges who condemned him gave a sum of money to the city, the interest on which was to be devoted to the setting up and perpetual burning of a lamp, known as the "lamp of expiation," in the palace of the doges. It is still burning there.

Never since history records were there such colossal enterprises in the industrial and economic world as there are now. Manufacturing and mercantile establishments whose capital run far up into the millions are so common as to excite no remark. But when one thinks of it he will notice that the machinery itself used in this age of great enterprises represents the gigantic ideas of the time. Engines, driving wheels, manufacturing machinery of all kinds are tremendous. Ocean steamers have grown so large that they even approach the size of the Great Eastern, that great wonder of the world twenty-five years ago. Single engines will no longer drive them, so the compound engine has been introduced and the twin screw. Blast furnaces turn out as much metal in a day as they did in a week twenty years ago. At the Soho iron work, in England, is a Corliss engine forty-eight feet high and of 5,000 horse power. It is the largest in the world. At the Homestead steel works of Pittsburg the fly wheel of a Corliss engine now being erected will weigh 200,000. At the Deptford electric lighting stations near London the Ferranti dynamo are forty-five feet high, weigh 500 tons, and make sixty revolutions in a minute.

The Divining Rod.

A correspondent who recently accompanied the boy Rodwell on an expedition of mineral vein and water discovery sends me the following interesting story of his experiences (says "Ellin in the Newcastle Daily Chronicle"): From time to time I had read newspaper reports about "the boy with the divining rod." Being curious and somewhat sceptical as to the truth of these reports, and also desirous of knowing something of the marvelous gift which the boy Frederick Rodwell is reported to possess, I determined to test personally their veracity, and with a friend accompanied the boy over the mountainous and almost untroubled district of Dufton Fall, Arranging, accordingly, some days ago, with the Dutton Fell Lead Ore Barytes company, limited, near Appleby, Westmorland, the boy Frederick Rodwell was invited to traverse their royalty. In appearance the boy is strong, healthy, and robust, and without the nervous attenuated physique that is generally found connected with magnetism magnetic sleep or clairvoyance. He also gives the impression of having a manly integrity about him not always found in boys of fifteen. The "divining rod," however, proves to be a misnomer, for although he carried a twig which he cut off a tree as he walked along, he said he did it simply to indicate to those who accompanied him the sudden effect the discovery of a vein had upon his own body. He was first taken into the vicinity of several known veins, and indicated correctly their position; then he was taken over an untried district, and found several new veins, giving the exact bearing of one for a distance of three-quarters of a mile. A trial has since been made of this vein which proves that the boy is correct, for the vein is both strong and promising. He also indicated the location and course of an underground water current which we followed until we found it issuing from the hillside. Now comes the marvelous part of the affair. Was discovery really made in this wise? Taking hold of the boy's right hand, walking our usual pace, suddenly we were arrested in our course by an electric current passing from his body through mine, making me feel as though I had touched an electric battery. This condition remained so long as we continued on the vein, but the moment we passed over it the boy's normal condition returned. Once the effect remained while we passed over three or four yards. We tested the boy over and over again by returning and walking over the vein several times, and each time we touched the vein the same effect was conveyed from the boy. Now as the company had no knowledge of this new vein they are convinced that the boy Frederick Rodwell must have the power of discovering minerals and water. I understand the boy has now been engaged to go to Australia to "divine" the underground water and minerals of its arid and auriferous regions.

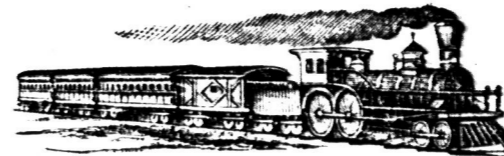
