#### No More Dummies.

CIGAR BOXES MUST NOW BE DESTROYED WHEN EMPTY.

An officer of the inland revenue department has called upon all the cigar dealers in the city, and served them with the following notice:

"You are hereby informed that by the amendment made to section 263 of the intend revenue act during the last session' of parliament, it is required that all packages containing cigars shall be destroyed as soon as the same

The penalty for neglect to comply with this regulation is a fine of \$200 and it applies to all people who buy cigars in boxes. The regulation will act particularly against dealers who are in the habit of tilling up the shelves in their stores with empty cigar boxes. Henceforth all the boxes in sight will be known to be full of cigars, or the revenue officers will know the reason why. It is said the regulations will be strictly enforced.—Hamilton Spec-
