##### ITEMS OF INTEREST IN CONDENSED FORM.

Jay Gould, of New York, has been fined \$100 for not answering to a summons to act as a petit juror.

There is a brick famine in Manitoba, and in consequence building operations in many instances are suspended.

Count Herbert Bismark has been betrothed to Edith Amelia, the eldest daughter of the Countess of Dudley.

The Committee on the liberation of the Russian people has issued a manifesto announcing revolutionary intentions.

Benj. Newgass, of London, Eng., offers a million and a quarter dollars yearly for the privilege of the Louisiana State Lottery.

Senator Pettigrew, of South Dakota, says enough tin will be produced in Dakota next year to supply the whole United States.

A positive declaration has been made by President Harrison that he will not be a candidate for renomination under any circumstances.

The revised returns Wednesday give the Mercer Government 49 seats and the opposition 21, or a clear majority for the Government of 28 votes.

A warrant is out for the arrest of Alfred Lossing, of North Grimsby, charged with incest upon his daughters, aged nineteen, sixteen, and thirteen.

A despatch from Buenos Ayres says Senator Garcia, the new Minister of Finance of the Argentine Republic, intends publicly to burn \$15,000,000 of the \$30,000,000 one dollar notes illegally issued.

The effect of the complete "tie up" of all the Cleveland railways by the striking switchmen is beginning to be felt by business men and manufacturers, and a food and fuel famine is threatened.

On Tuesday night as an engine with six men went down the Canadian Pacific railway track, between Clarendon and Locust Hill, to locate a reported wash out, the engine dashed through a weakened culvert and was precipitated into a raging creek below. Only one man escaped.

He indignantly sailed away, and has laid the matter before the Washington Government, claiming that under the treaty of 1818 he has the right to get bait on the French shore.

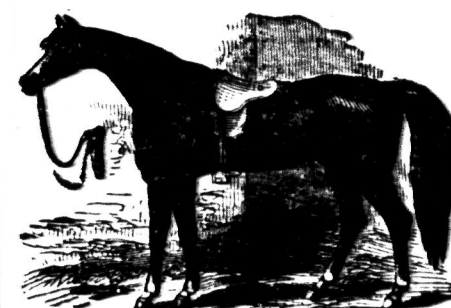
