The Old Story.

For some time past a stranger has been at work in Prescott and vicinity organizing an association of farmers, the object of which is to obtain the lowest possible rates at the stores in Prescott. Each of the four or five hundred farmers who joined the association paid the stranger 50 cents for a membership ticket. A large number of Prescott merchants went into the enterprise and agreed to furnish members of the association with goods at a low profit, the farmers agreeing to trade at their stores in the future. Each merchant who joined the combination was assessed a certain amount by the stranger. Now many people, who do not belong to the association, refuse to trade at any store which gives to the farmers better rates than other customers. As a consequence several merchants desire to withdraw from the combination. The association seems likely to collapse while the man who organized it has gone to seek new fields.—Ingersoll Chronicle.

John Bull's Big Warships.

New York, June 22.—The British warships Hercules, Sirius and Spartan have been ordered to duty on the North American coast. The Hercules is one of England's largest ironclads. The Sirius and Spartan are two of her fastest cruisers. The orders referring to the above-mentioned vessels follow a series of recent British naval orders which have caused it to be observed in American naval circles that Great Britain is quietly replacing all her ships now on the American coast by the most powerful war vessels she can spare. The Hercules relieves the flagship Bellerophon; the Sirius and Spartan relieve the Emerald and Comus, both inferior ships.

The Hercules brings out from England Vice-Admiral Hopkins. This officer will command all British warships now ordered to American waters. Two additional cruisers have been selected to relieve the gunboats Ready and Thrush. An armored cruiser will relieve the Tourmaline. It is declared in well-informed government circles that the British admiralty proposes to offset in fighting efficiency the new vessels of the United States navy. To do this the admiralty will send over vessels to increase the fleet in America in proportion to the growth of the new navy of the United States. British naval officers believe that by reason of her great size the Hercules is a more powerful vessel than the new American armored cruiser Maine will be. With the possible exception of the Miantinoh, they say that the Hercules is more than a match for any of the American warships now in commission. The British force in American waters will in future be larger than at any time since the civil war. It has been constantly increasing until now it has assumed formidable proportions. Besides increasing her naval force, Great Britain during the past three years has increased by one half the strength of her troops in the West Indies. These troops she has stationed at Jamaica and Bermuda.

Lilliputians Married.

VEVAY, Ind., June 21.—Quite a novel wedding occurred here the other evening. Rev. Anderson, of the Christian Church, was the officiating minister. The groom was Jasper Bradley, of Crawford county, Ind., aged 31 years. He weighs 69 pounds and is 53 inches in height. The bride was Miss Jennie McKay, aged 31 years, weighing 31 pounds, and is 51 inches in height. The bride couple were both born and raised in Switzerland Co., Ind., and

their ancestors are large and powerful people physically. The diminutive couple are well developed and handsomely formed, bright and intelligent, and they are little only in stature. An elegant reception was tendered them, after which a concourse of friends escorted them to a steambot, where they took passage for their future home at Crawford county.

The Preacher's Bad Break.

There has been a vacancy in the Port Dalhousie and Rockway circuit of the Presbyterian church for some months and the congregations had about decided to call a young minister who had preached successful trial sermons in Port Dalhousie. But there's many a slip, etc. Last Sunday he went out to Rockway to preach and was in the middle of his sermon when a baby in the congregation commenced to squeal.

The minister stopped and requested that the child be removed. The baby quieted down for a moment and he again proceeded, but had not gone very far when the youngster cried again. He then ordered the mother to go out with the baby and she did so.

As she reached the door she turned around and exclaimed: "Jesus said, 'Suffer little children to come unto Me,' but you don't appear to feel that way." The woman then left and the services proceeded again, when the woman's daughter, who is a prominent member of the choir, arose, and with fire in her eye gave the pastor a little advice.

"You mind your sermon and mother will mind the baby all right," she said, and picking up her music book also left the church.

There was considerable excitement, and the affair has been the talk of the neighborhood since.

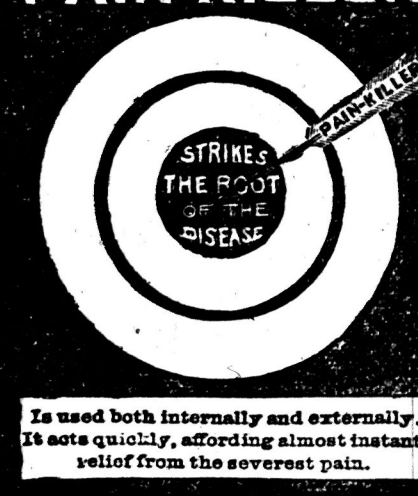

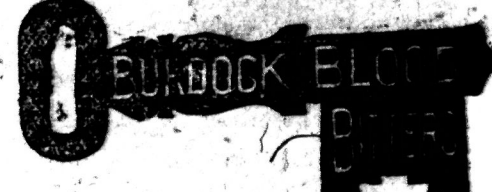
