Five delegates to Europe in connection with the World's Fair were appointed on Wednesday.

Three boys were arrested on Wednesday on a charge of attempting to wreck the Erie night express.

Brigands have captured wealthy residents of Broussa, Asia Minor, and are holding them for ransom.

The drill corps of the St. Bernard Commandery, Chicago, will visit Hamilton, Ont., next month.

The Western Floods.

LEMARS, Iowa, June 26.—A heavy flood came down Willow creek yesterday, entering the Floyd river about a mile above Lemars. The bottom land along the river at once became a raging torrent, nearly a mile wide. The flood washed over a mile of embankment twenty feet high on the Illinois Central track a mile east of Lemars, where the railway crosses the river. The crops on the bottom were entirely destroyed. Hundreds of head of cattle and horses were found swimming in their pastures and were rescued by men in boats. No lives were lost.

TOPEKA, Kansas, June 26.—The heaviest rain storm of the season occurred here yesterday. The storm was general in the eastern part of the State. Parts of the Santa Fe & Kansas Pacific roads were washed out between here and St. Lawrence. Washouts have also occurred at Williamstown on the Union Pacific and on the Santa Fe. The damage to crops will be great, as the harvest is in progress in Eastern and Southern Kansas.

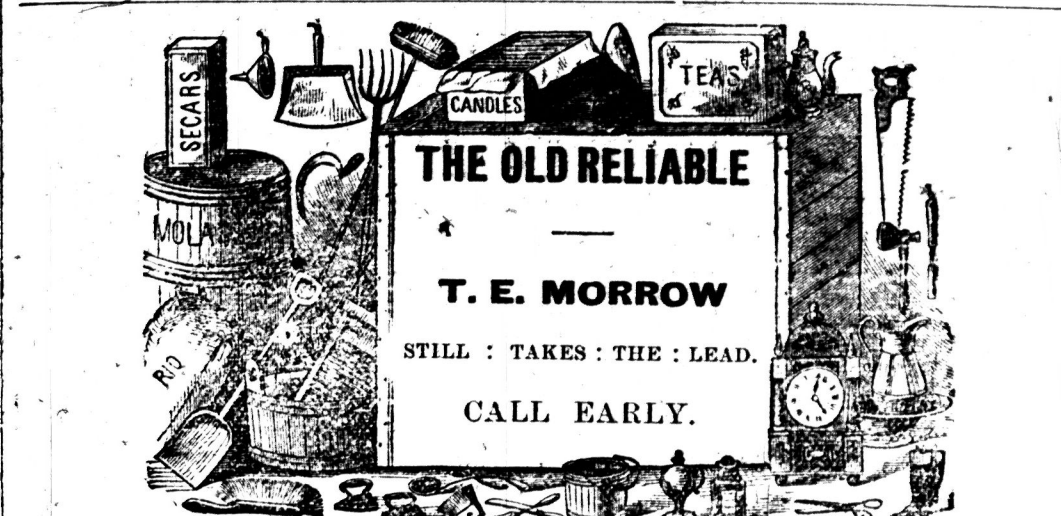
