

#### Protest.

AGAINST THE PROPOSED NEW MINING POLICY OF THE ONTARIO GOVERNMENT.

The discovery of nickel in the Sudbury region has, for some years, attricted the attention of the explorer, and the application and uses of the nickel-steel having become apparent to the capitalist the people of Algoma looked forward with the hope that the coming spring would bring a large influx of men and money to the District, but the Mining Act, as introduced in the Legislative Assembly of Ontario, will completely tie up all mineral lands and debar all capitalists from investing or developing unpatented mineral land. Our iron deposits have never been worked and are almost worthless unless we get reciprocity or have the District de-

Very lately there has been immense rich deposits of nickel ore discovered in Frankenstein, Germany, and with unimited capital and cheap labor Germany, it is questionable if the Sudbury mines can more than compete with Mrs. Winslow's Soothing Syrup has been those mines for the American market.

As the nickel is contained in iron oyrites which has heretofore been looked upon as worthless by the explorer, we fear that, during the next summer, there will be rich nickel deposits discovered in the United States, and, in that case, our nickel product would, under the present state of affairs, be summarily shut out of the United States market and our far famed nickel mines become of doubtful value; but, in any event, we believe in the principle that, as life is extremely short, we should "make hay while the sun shines," and accordingly, strain every effort to get men and capital into our province.

Algoma, with all her rich natural resources, appears to be unfortunate. The Indian Department's regulations respecting the some 200 sq. miles surrounding Sault Ste. Marie have been sufficiently illiberal to prevent the sale of even one mining location within the last year, and lack of railway facilities or roads running into the interior of this point drives the explorer to Sudbury, notwithstanding that nickel deposits have been discovered; in this part of

The imposition of a royalty on mineral

means ruin to Algoma. We cannot understand the government reserving the mineral from the locatee when, in most cases, in the United States, none but the actual settler can purchase either timber or mineral lands, and it is that principle that causes their booms every time an Indian reserve is put on the market, as sometimes the choice timber sections are worth from \$5,000 to \$10,000 per 160 acres.

We fail to understand why Algoma, because it is not a prairie country, should be sacrificed to support old Ontario and her various educational

and other institutions. The farmers of Algoma have strongly and tersely stated that the pioneer is more deserving at the hands of Ontario

than the politician. With 26 members of the Legislative Assembly who are farmers, Algoma can surely hope to have a more liberal policy for the actual miner and farmer. Let the rights of citizenship be of some intrinsic value in Ontario, as it has always been in the United States.

Unless Ontario adopts a more liberal policy designed to settle and develop Algoma, she will soon ignominiously become a third-rate province, netwithstanding her vast and boundless re-

Without unrestricted reciprocity we must have more liberal laws for the

whole country is prosperous.

With respect to the proposed mining legislatian the Board of Trade of Sault Ste. Marie, the town council and the Farmer's Institute have all passed resolutions against it .- Sault Ste. Marie Express.

#### Look After Your Vote.

Up to the 1st of August any person having the proper qualifications may apply by affidavit to be put on the Dominion Voters' List, setting forth in his affidavit any one of the grounds upon which he is entitled to be added to the list. These grounds are briefly as follows:

1. Owner of real estate-In a city this is \$300; in towns, \$200; in villages or country sections, \$150.

2. Tenant-The rental must be at least \$2 monthly, \$6 quarterly or \$20 yearly.

3. Occupant—The applicant must have been a bona fide occupant for one year prior to application of real property of the value of \$300 in cities; \$200 in town's or \$150 elsewhere.

4. Income—Applicant must be a resident in electoral district and derive an income of at least \$300 a year earnings in money or money's worth, or from some profession, calling, trade or investment in Canada, and has so derived such income, and been a resident of Canada for one year next before being placed upon the lists.

5. Farmer's son Applicant must

have resided with his father one year before being put on the list, and as many sons may be put on as the value of the father's property will permit, allowing each son the same amount as entitles the father to be put on.

6. Owner's son-Applicant must be the son of an owner of real estate other than a farm, and the father's property must be sufficient to give each son applying a qualification equal to that required of an owner. For example: In country districts if an owner's property is valued at \$750, the owner and four sons may be placed on the list, as this would allow \$150 to each.

7. Tenant's son-Applicant must be son of tenant of farm of not less thantwenty acres, and leased for not less than five years, and have resided with his father at least one year before going

8. Fisherman—Applicant must be a fisherman and the owner of real estate and fishing gear, which together are at least of the value of \$150.

9. Annuitant-Applicant must have resided within the electoral district one year before being put on the list, and in receipt of a life annuity secured on real estate in Canada of at least \$100.


