ITEMS OF INTEREST IN CONDENSED FORM.

Samuel Leah was drowned in the Ross pond at Embro, Ont., Thursday.

Investigation shows that the Northern Minnesota Indians are perfectly peaceable.

Mr. Parnell has paid the costs in the O'Shea divorce case. They amounted to \$5,000.

A cyclone at West Superior, Wis., Friday killed several men and blew down many buildings.

Salton lake, in the Colorado desert, continues rising. The overflow now reaches 2,000 square miles.

The international cricket match resulted in favor of the Americans by 36 runs after a closely played game.

A tramp named James Logan had both feet cut off while trying to board a freight train near Cobourg Thursday.

Francis R. Rives, the millionaire, died Thursday at his residence, near New Hamburg, N. Y., in the 70th year of his age.

The mammoth lumber interests represented in Omaha by the Howell Lumber Company are in financial distress.

The British steamer Coningsby, from Marseilles, has been wrecked near the island of Cheduba in the bay of Bengal. No loss of life.

More disastrous storms have taken place in Missouri. Some lives have been lost near Kansas City, and roads and crops have been destroyed.

A man named William English, about 55 years of age, was found dead in a well on the farm occupied by his brother-in-law, Paul Dynes, near Acton, Ont., Thursday.

The Dominion fishery cruiser Dream swooped down on some Maine fishing vessels from Eastport Friday and captured seven of them, which she towed to St. Andrews, N. B.

Mining News.

A report on la grippe prepared by Dr. Parsons, an officer of the Local Government Board in England, is given in outline in The Times of the 4th inst. The complaint is said to be "communicable in the ordinary relations of individuals to one another." The common belief has been that it fell upon certain localities all at once as the result of some miasmatic influence. But there seems to be abundant proof that a few dropping cases have preceded the epidemic in every locality; and that, as the disease is manifestly one of a very short period of incubation, there has been ample time for each of these dropping cases to act as a centre of unsuspected contagion. More than one sudden outbreak appears to have followed some local gathering together of people, such as at church or at market, where there were at least opportunities of free communication between infected people or convalescents and the healthy. The period of incubation, as nearly as can be ascertained, seems to range from sixteen hours to two or, at most, three days, although a supposed interval of five days has been recorded. The shortness of this period is alone sufficient to produce an apparent suddenness of invasion which, when the facts have not been carefully sifted and scrutinized by competent observers, has been mistaken for simultaneous incidence upon the whole population of a locality. Dr. Parsons shows that persons remote from human intercourse, as lighthouse keepers, deep-sea fishermen and others, have been remarkably free from the disease. The supposition of another expert is that the contagium of la grippe is a microbe which enters the system through the surface of the eye, and which exerts its chief effect upon the nervous system. This hypothesis derives some support from the fact that equine influenza is commonly called pink-eye, but it cannot yet be regarded in any other light than as an ingenious suggestion. If it were hereafter established, the chief defence against la grippe would probably be the employment of parasite-destroying remedies in the form of eye lotions.
