## Haldimand Assizes.

A PECULIAR DIVORCE SUIT—CHARGE TO THE GRAND JURY.

CAYUGA, Nov. 2.—The Haldimand Fall Assizes opened here to-day, Hon. Mr. Justice MacMahon presiding. The criminal docket is heavy, and contains charges of incest, perjury and personation. Mr. Carscallen, of Hamilton, acts for the crown.

There are two civil cases, one of which was tried this afternoon in camera the public not being admitted to listen to the details. It was an action by Charlotte Lyons against her husband, Augustus Matthews, praying for an annulment of their marriage contract. They were married in Dunnville in 1877, lived together some three months, and then separated. Since that time they have lived apart. The wife alleged that the marriage had never been consummated. The defendant admitted this, but said it was owing to crankiness on the part of the wife. Outside of the plaintiff and defendant the case turned upon medical testimony, and resulted in the plaintiff's case being dismissed with costs, and Charlotte Lyons still has a husband. As far as known, this is the first case of the kind tried in Canada. Numerous trials of a like nature have taken place in England. Mr. Colter acted for the plaintiff; Mr. Staunton for the defendant.

In charging the grand jury, Mr. Justice MacMahon, referring to the charges of personation at the late election, said that he could conceive of nothing more detestable than the man who would deprive another of his vote and take away his franchise. A man who would do this would not hesitate at committing other species of larceny. If the people of the country want to be honestly and well governed, they must start at the polls. The ballot was given to the people and for the people in order that they might have honest representatives in Parliament.

The grand jury returned a true bill against S. Atkinson, charged with incest.

The Empire is sending out a Premium with its Weekly this fall which will be highly prized by the friends and followers of the late Premier of the Dominion. It is in the shape of a Memorial Album, illustrating the career of Sir John Macdonald, from his birthplace in Glasgow to his last resting place in Catarqui Cemetery. The series of handsome views are in photogravure, executed in a manner that is a credit to Canadian art, and comprise an excellent photograph of the old Chieftain, taken a short time previous to his death; a handsome portrait of his devoted widow, the Baroness Macdonald; his birthplace in Glasgow, being a view of Brunswick Place near the Turngate, which will be recognized by all who are familiar with that city; a portrait of Sir John as a young man, being a fac simile of the earliest photograph known to be in existence; an excellent and striking likeness of his mother, from whom he inherited his force of character and genius; the old home on Bideau street, Kingston, in which he lived during the rebellion of 1837; the finest view ever published of Earnsccliffe, his well known residence in Ottawa; interior view of the Senate Chamber, as it appeared with the body lying in state, showing the floral tributes and members of Parliament guarding the remains, with the Queen's wreath resting on the coffin; view of Parliament Buildings, with funeral procession forming in front; the funeral passing the eastern block, with fine view of the buildings; magnificent view of the City Hall, Kingston, draped as it appeared on morning of funeral; beautiful photograph of the grave at Catarqui Cemetery, with the floral offerings and cadets guarding it; exterior view of Westminster Abbey in which memorial service was held, from a celebrated etching; photographic view of interior of Westminster; handsome view of St. Paul's Cathedral, in which it is proposed to erect memorial tablet; interior of St. Paul's Cathedral. The cover of this collection of photogravures is a beautiful work of art, the title being richly embossed in silver, with a medallion of the Chieftain in relief, surrounded by his now memorable words, "A British subject I was born, a British subject I will die," while the background shows shield with the British arms, and the whole is surmounted with drapery in royal purple, fringed with silver. A premium like this has never before been offered by a newspaper in Canada, and will no doubt be eagerly sought after, as it will be an ornament to a parlor table as well as a valuable souvenir of the old Chieftain.
