Walpole Council.

WALPOLE TOWN HALL,
October, 5th, 1891.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment, the members all present.

The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

Abraham King came before the Council and stated that he was unable to work and entirely destitute, and asked for support, when it was moved by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Winger, and resolved, that the Clerk be instructed to communicate with John King with reference to the support of his father, Abraham King, and that in the meantime Mr. King be left in care of Mr. Winger.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stonehouse, seconded by Mr. Clark, and resolved, that Mr. Smith be appointed a commissioner to repair the bridge over Nanticoke Creek on the 5th Concession.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Winger, and resolved, that this Council grant the sum of \$25.00 to the Walpole Agricultural Society. Yeas, Smith and Winger, nays, Clark and Stonehouse.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Stonehouse, seconded by Mr. Smith, and resolved, that leave be granted to introduce a Bill to authorize the issue of debentures to pay for the erection of an addition to the school house in School Section No. 14, and that the bill be read a first time.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Clark, seconded by Mr. Stonehouse, and resolved, that the bill be read a second time.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Winger, and resolved, that the bill be read a third time, passed, signed and intitled a by-law as in the original motion.—Carried.

Mr. Jaques was referred to the County Council of Haldimand, as a bridge of the length required would come under their jurisdiction.
