Mrs. Ebenezer Chase was also in the dental rooms. Dr. Henning administered chloroform to Miss Boulton, who was considered a proper subject, as she was apparently healthy, and weighed not less than one hundred and fifty pounds. But the chloroform was too powerful for her and Miss Boulton died in the chair.

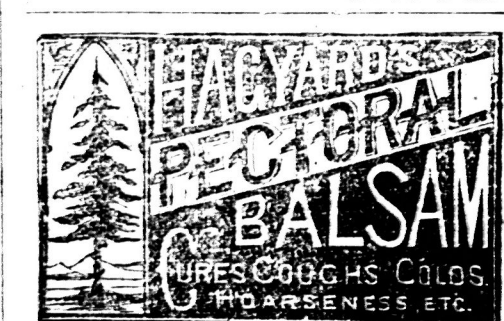
