A Maidman Sensation.

A MAN AND HIS WIFE ARRESTED FOR
WILFUL DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY.

A Hagersville despatch of the 15th
inst. says: Government Detective
Murray, of Toronto, arrested Charles
O'Hara and his wife, of the township of
Rainham, to-day for malicious destruc-
tion of property. Wm. J. Dougherty,
a shoemaker, of Hagersville, owns a
farm adjoining O'Hara's which Dough-
erty had rented to Walter Moulton for
farming purposes. O'Hara wanted to
rent a portion of the farm from Moulton
for pasture, which was refused because
of the lack of fence protection. O'Hara
then swore that nothing would be
allowed to grow on the farm, and had
made several threats. It appears that
he once owned this farm, and that
circumstances connected with his losing
possession have made him desirous of
revenge, though Dougherty was in no
way to blame. On one occasion the
ploughs and harrows belonging to
Moulton were placed upon a pile of rails
and set on fire and destroyed. On
another occasion eleven or twelve of
the best apple trees were girdled, and
again, later on in the season, a field of
barley, about heading, was cut and
slashed with a scythe irregularly and
in different places and much of the crop
destroyed. On another occasion fencing
was thrown down, set fire to and burned.
Things became so bad that the Govern-
ment was requested to send a detective.
Some time ago Detective Murray was
sent to investigate the matter. Al-
though suspicion pointed towards
O'Hara there was not sufficient evidence
to have him arrested. When the de-
tective arrived here on Saturday even-
ing, after making several inquiries he
found sufficient evidence to warrant
the arrest of O'Hara and his wife. This
morning Detective Murray with Con-
stant Knisley and Fleming went to the
township of Rainham, made the
arrest, and brought out a number of
unwilling witnesses. They were taken
before S. W. Howard and Hugh Stewart,
Justices of the Peace, and after several
had given evidence the Magistrates
committed the prisoners to Cayuga jail
in default of \$600 each, to stand their
trial at the Fall Assizes.
