## BURIAL OF SPANISH MONARCH

Weird Ceremonial Custom as Prescribed for Obsequies.

Strange and almost weird is the ceremonial which accompanies the burial of Spanish kings. The pantheon or royal tomb is at the palace of the Escorial, situated 3,000 feet above the level of the sea and some distance from the capital. Only kings, queens and mothers of kings are buried there, the coffins of the kings lying on one side, those of the queens on the other. After lying in state for several days in the throne-room in Madrid an enormous procession is formed, accompanying the body to the Escorial. A halt is made on the way and the corpse rests there for one night. In the morning the lord high chamberlain stands at the side of the coffin and says in loud tones: "Is your majesty pleased to proceed on your journey?"

After a short silence the procession moves on and winds up to the grand portal of the palace. These doors are never opened except to admit a royal personage, dead or alive. When the casket containing the remains is at last placed in the vault the chamberlain unlocks it and, kneeling down, calls with a loud voice, "Senor! Senor! Senor!" After a solemn pause, he cries again, "His majesty does not reply. Then it is true, the king is dead!" He then locks the coffin, gives the key to the prior (the palace of the Escorial contains also a large monastery and church), and, taking his staff of office, breaks it in pieces and flings them at the casket. The booming of the guns and the tolling of bells announce to the nation that the king has gone to his final resting place.—San Francisco Argonaut.

If the signs, which are prominently and frequently displayed, fail of their purpose the offenders are to be fined.

Already the kingdom of the long skirt has been contested by its shorter rival. The abbreviated bit of wearing apparel started with the popularity of bicycle riding. From the wheel and the golf links it was but a step to the street. Champions of the short skirt are hailing with joy the action of the Vienna folk. They see in this Austrian initiative great possibilities, even local legislative action, in behalf of their favorite garb. They are ready with reasons why the clipped wear is to be commended. For example, speaking of the comparative values, one little woman said:

"I wear a short skirt because I can get around in it so much easier than I can in a long one. I find the change invaluable from the point of convenience. When I want to run out to market I don't feel like putting on my trailing skirt, which is bound to gather in all the dust and dirt from the sidewalk and the thousand and one unpleasant articles which adorn the floors of the butcher's, the baker's, and the candlestick maker's. I am so used to the short skirt now that I wear it when I go down town shopping. And, let me confess it, I am secure in it to the opera, when the night happened to be disagreeable and the opera one that I didn't want to miss."

On the other hand, there are countless women who are not ready to relinquish the old order. As one of these has it—

"We wear the trailing skirt because it is fashionable. Why is it fashionable? Oh, because it is that's all. For one thing, it gives a woman a more distinguished appearance. 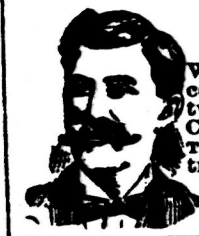
