Dairy Production

Proper Care of Milk to be Demonstrated at the Canadian National.

The educational features in connection with the Dairy department of the Canadian National Exhibition, Toronto, promises to be of unusual interest this year, not only to farmers, but to consumers of milk in cities and towns as well. The demonstration work and leetures in the Dairy amphitheatre will be under the immediate charge of Mr. Geo. A. Putman, director of dairy instructions for the Province, and the Dominion Department will also furnish a man to give some de. finite instruction along the cowtesting line.

The proper care and handling of milk will be one of the subjects dealt with, and it will be accompanied by demonstrations of milk festing as well as charts showing the value of cow-testing associations.
