The Irishman's nature is somewhat of a paradox: he loves his island so much he's dissatisfied until he gets away from it. Tradition has it that good St. Patrick banished snakes from the Emerald Isle. If he could have gone farther by dethroning King Barleycorn his war against snakes would have been more complete. The lack of Home Rule has been too long made a scapegoat for the evils Ireland endures. No country in the empire enjoys more privileges than she, and those of her sons who are not blinded by prejudice recognize it, and attribute the grievances suffered under to their proper sources. Let all true Irishmen keep green in their hearts the memory of their patron saint not forgetting that he stood for progress and truth in the proper interpretation of the words.

If nothing else comes of the murder investigation in Hamilton, the law students all over the country by perusing the full reports in the city papers, should have received valuable lessons in the art of hurling questions.
