Notwithstanding the Dunville Chronicle celebrated the event last week, the house of refuge question is not yet settled. A special meeting of the county council will be held tomorrow to go further into the matter, and there's many a slip 'twixt the first and third readings.

Certain Irish organizations are taking steps to put a stop to the "wike" and "Pat" characters exploited in the theatres and by the funny papers. What they are kicking at must be the sacrifice of the ideal Irishman. The everyday Irishman is too handsome a chap to be classed with the stage production.

It is feared that unless something is done to alleviate the expense in connection with Massey hall, Toronto, the auditorium will have to be sold. Surely this province can maintain one good sized convention hall if it is too much for Toronto alone. We don't think there would be much kick if a provincial grant were made to help sustain the institution in view of the fact that its scope of usefulness is wider than the confines of Toronto.

The Funnville Chronicle thinks we are "dopy." Gratifying to realize our esteemed contemporary has been indulging in a little original thinking. But the Chronicle should be more specific; the term "dopy" is a little too ambiguous. The other day we received a budget of news items pertaining to an exhibition to be held somewhere in the western states. In the introductory letter the word "dope" was used as a synonym for the word "news." Probably it was in a similar sense the Chronicle employed the word "dopy."

Notes from Winnipeg.

Winnipeg, March 20. Prices recently obtained for farms in the Carberry district afford much light on the money increase of Western Canadian land when brought under cultivation, as compared with the same land, wild, not long ago.

Mr. E. Bailey of Carberry, sold a section to John Witherspoon for \$35,000, an average of \$5 per acre. Mr. Bailey's farm is a good one, is but four miles from the town of Carberry, has good buildings upon it and a comfortable house. Mr. Fletcher Craig bought half a section for \$16,000, and Mr. J. G. Barron, the well-known pure-bred stock raiser, bought a quarter for \$6,650. These prices are from \$11 to \$46 per acre. These are bona fide sales, and the prices are considered reasonable by the actual cultivators of the soil in that particular locality.

The members of the building trades, the architects, and lumber, brick and supply dealers, have reason to anticipate a heavy season in their respective lines and their calculations are based upon the record of the large number of building permits that have been taken out since Jan. 1, this year. All through the whole of Western Canada there are a remarkable number of structures to be erected in the larger centres. From a reliable source your correspondent is informed that in ten of these Western cities there is now in view the construction of new buildings to the value of \$30,000,000, and of this amount Winnipeg will contribute \$10,000,000. At Calgary and Edmonton there is much rivalry for the building supremacy in Alberta, and Regina and Brandon can be

depended upon at holding their own, and big totals will result in both cities. Medicine Hat, Moose Jaw, Prince Albert, Saskatoon and Lethbridge are other cities that will share in the general prosperity.
