Visit of Lord Lansdowne, Governor General of Canada, to Long Point Cottages in 1883.

I received notice from the President of the Long Point Co. that Governor General Lord Lansdowne would arrive by special train, and that I was to be in readiness to take him and staff to the Cottages at Long Point, and to allow no passengers on the boat.

The day came on which he was to arrive. When at dinner Mrs. Alderson said a bouquet of flowers will be nice for the table at Cottages and she would prepare one and Ida (our daughter) could give it to his Lordship.

The train having arrived and I wished to see how many passengers I was to have, I sauntered toward the station. I saw them coming on the south side of the street, and I not wishing to meet them crossed over to the north side. When opposite me they halted and the president of the Long Point Co. called me to come over. I did so. The president said to a very pleasant looking gentleman, "Your Lordship, Captain Alderson, in whose care you now are." His Lordship said, "I am pleased to meet you," at the same time he linked arms with me and we proceeded toward the boat. He said, "Captain, I feel quite safe in your care for I have had a very flattering account of you as a sailor having no accident. (Little did we think how close we would be to a frightful one ere many hours.)"

He then said "I am wholly in your charge. Will you grant me a favor, and do not introduce me to anyone on the dock, (now all Dover was on the wharf and many from the country) but take me directly aboard." I did as he desired, and when aboard I said, "My little daughter has a bouquet she wishes to give you." He said, "Is your wife also aboard?" I said, "Yes they are in the cabin." He said, "Will you take me to them and introduce me?" I did so, and he conversed with them until the boat's whistle blew the signal to start.

He escorted them to the gangway and they went ashore greatly pleased at having a real lord all to themselves for half an hour. Soon the Ivey Alderson was headed for the Cottages. We arrived about 4 o'clock, and as soon as our passengers were landed we returned to Dover.

In two days we returned for his Lordship and he came aboard and handed me an autograph album and said, "Tell Miss Alderson I was very pleased to place my name among those of her many friends, and if you ever visit England I shall be pleased to have you make my country house near London your home." I thanked him and said I would be pleased to.

We were soon ploughing down the channel. I gave the wheelman the course and told him to hold on to it until Dover light bore in view and then come up on it. I and Capt. Street sat down forward of the engine room, and had been conversing about an hour when I left him to make a tour of the boat to see all was right, when near the wheelhouse I noticed a light dead ahead and very close. Just then Fred Martin, one of my crew, came from behind the wheelhouse. I drew his attention to the light. He gazed a moment and as quick as a flash jumped to the wheel and jerked it from his brother's hands and put it hard over, and we rushed by a coal barge vessel, so close under her stern that her main boom scraped our boat. I cannot describe the terror of those few moments. Now, after the lapse of many years, when I recall the occurrence, a feeling of faintness overcomes me, and my heart goes up in gratitude to God for his mercy in saving us from a terrible accident. Had we collided my wish would have been among the dead.

The cause of our close call was a coal boat very low in the water, in fact her deck was awash amidships. She had dropped her anchor on account of no wind and hung a lantern in her main rigging. The wheelman (he is dead now, poor fellow) mistook it for Dover light, and, being shortsighted, was closer on it than he had any idea of when I discovered it.

Notice of By-Law

D. 1909, a By-law will be considered having for its object the incorporation of the territory described below into an incorporated Village to be called the Village of Jarvis and the following is the description of the territory:

Commencing at a point on the easterly boundary of Lot No. 4 in the 8th Concession of the said Township of Walpole where the southerly limit of the lands at present owned by John C. Sanderson would intersect the westerly limit of the lands at present owned by James Hazlett, thence southerly and along the easterly limits of the lands owned by the said James Hazlett to the northerly limit of the right of way of the Hamilton and Port Dover Railway Company, thence southwesterly and along the westerly limit of the said right of way to the intersection of the southerly limit of Talbot Street with the said right of way, thence westerly and along the said southerly limit of Talbot Street to the westerly limit of the lands at present owned by Lewis Miller, thence southerly and along the westerly limit of the land owned by Lewis Miller to the northerly limit of the lands at present standing in the name of Maud C. Lea, thence easterly to the easterly limit of the right of way of the said Hamilton and Port Dover Railway Company, thence following the line of the lands owned by Bryce Allen in a southerly and easterly direction to the easterly limit of the Hamilton and Port Dover Plank Road, thence easterly on a line parallel to Talbot Street, to the westerly limit of Lot No. 4 in the 7th Concession of the Township of Walpole, thence southerly along the said westerly limit of said Lot No. 4 to the centre of line of said Lot 4, thence easterly in a line parallel with Talbot Street to the centre of Lot No. 5 in the said 7th Concession of Walpole, thence northerly along the centre line of said Lot No. 5 to the southerly limit of said Lot No. 5, thence commencing at a point on the northerly side of Talbot Street opposite the said last mentioned point northerly along the centre line of Lot 5 in the 8th Concession of the Township of Walpole to the southerly limit of the Air Line Division of the Grand Trunk Railway Company, thence commencing at a point on the northerly side of the right of way of the said Air Line Division where the westerly limits of the lands at present owned by Joseph Ivey would intersect the same northerly along the said westerly limit to the northerly limit of the lands of the Grand Trunk Railway Company, thence westerly and along the said northerly limits of the lands of the Grand Trunk Railway Company to the Hamilton and Port Dover Plank Road.
