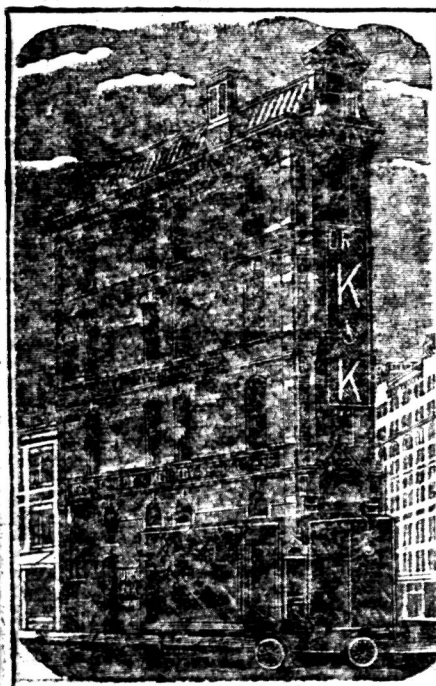

SIX THOUSAND MILE JOURNEY.

(Continued from 4th page.)

More scenic glory from the train
and now we stop at Banff, not yet too
satiated to admire the exquisite loca-
tion of this famed mountain resort, at
an altitude of 4,521 feet. The im-
pressive mountain ranges, the swift
running, winding Bow River, the
beautiful carriage drives and the
mountain paths combine to make of it
a place where we would wish to spend
some time. The Hot Sulphur Springs
here are much patronized. The ele-
gant Canadian Pacific Hotel, here,
open from May to October, furnishes
baths from these Hot Springs and
there is also a fine sanitarium, where
the baths are a large part of the treat-
ment for diseases. The more im-
portant springs have been improved
by the Government, and picturesque
bathing houses have been erected and
placed under the care of attendants.
In one locality is a pool inside a
dome-roofed cave, entered by an arti-
ficial tunnel, and adjacent, another
spring forms an open basin of warm
sulphurous water. When we are
taking the train at Banff, I feel some-
thing like a gourmand who has stuff-
ed on sweets, to the last possible
dimensions, and the still magnificent
scenery scarcely elicits more than a
quiet "Ah!" The train passes on
more or less slowly, until we reach
Calgary, altitude 3,428 feet, and 642
miles from Vancouver. This is an
important town of about 25,000 popu-
lation, charmingly situated on a hill-
girt plateau. Calgary is a great
ranching centre, source of supplies
for mining districts, a large milling
centre and an important station of
the Royal Northwest Mounted Police.
Medicine Hat, christened by Rud-
yard Kipling "The town that was born
lucky," is 200 miles further on. It has
an immense flow of natural gas, an
abundance of coal, four large brick
plants, flour mills and green houses.
It is in the centre of a fine agricul-
tural district. The river is naviga-
ble for from some distance above
the town all the way to Winnipeg.
We pass through other fast grow-
ing towns, Moose Jaw being quite im-
portant.

Regina, the capital of Saskatchewan
province is well worth more than
passing mention. It has a popula-
tion of about 15,000 or 20,000 and is
rapidly growing. Here are situat-
ed the headquarters of the Northwest
Mounted Police. The Lieutenant
Governor's residence is here, and the
new Provincial Government building
is being erected at a cost of \$1,500,000.
The altitude of Regina is 1,875
feet.

Shortly after leaving Calgary we
left even the foothills behind, and
since then we have looked over the
unending prairie. We have seen
great herds of horses in the lower
valleys, thousands of cattle on the ter-
races and flocks of sheep on the hill
tops, and for a long time now we have
been looking out over vast tracts of
oats, just about ready to harvest, then
wheat and more wheat shocked. (I be-
lieve shocked is the word) anyway
its done up in bunches ready to be
taken from the fields.

Brandon and Portage La Prairie
are two other towns of good size
through which the C.P.R. passes be-
fore reaching Winnipeg. Brandon
has a population of about 15,000 and is
one of the largest grain markets in
Manitoba. It has grain elevators,
flour mills, planing mills, banks and
a number of manufactories. It has
well made streets and is beautifully
situated. A Dominion Experimental
Farm, and a Provincial Asylum are
established near the city.

Portage La Prairie, situated on the
Assiniboine River, is the market town
of an excellent grain district. It has
large flour mills and many grain ele-
vators, an oat-meal mill, fence wire
factory, and several other industries.
The North West branch of the Cana-
dian Pacific Railway branches off
here. The town is an educational
and residential centre.

At Winnipeg we make our last Cana-
dian stop. We have travelled over
1,182 miles since leaving Vancouver
and have been in four Canadian prov-
inces. Winnipeg (old Fort Garry)
in 1872 had a population of 100, now
it is the third largest city in Canada.
I believe they claim something over
125,000. It is situated at the junct-
ure of the Red and Assiniboine Rivers,
both navigable by steamboats. The
city is handsomely built of stone and
brick. Every street is asphalt pave-
ment and Main Street and Portage
Avenue are magnificently broad, the
one being 130 feet and the other 200
feet (that sounds too big to be true,
and I shall write to my friends in
Winnipeg about it, and if I am mis-
taken I'll "fess up" later). Anyway
I do not remember of ever having
seen wider streets. Leaving Winni-
peg in the evening another 24 hours
journey takes us over the last 1000
miles.

I am home again, after five weeks
of absence, enriched by a great num-
ber of magnificent pictures, that will
remain in the gallery of my mind to
be recalled for my enjoyment, as
long as my memory endures. If I
have been instrumental in giving any
pleasure to your readers by recount-
ing a little of my journey I am doubly
repaid.
