County Council Meets.

March 23, 1910.
Council met pursuant to adjournment. All members were present except Mr. Neerod. Minutes of former meeting were read and adopted.

The following communications were read:—
March 19th—Minister of Education.
March 16th—Victoria Industrial School.
March 19th—J. M. Glenn.

Moved by Mr. Anderson, seconded by Mr. Parsons, that the salary of the Superintendent of the House of Refuge be fixed at \$325.00 per annum, and that of the matron be \$175.00 or \$500.00 in all.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Anderson, seconded by Mr. Young, that the several applicants be admitted to the presence of the Council and the duties of the same be read to them and the form of duties as used by the House at Victoria be used in the meantime.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Robertson, seconded by Mr. Parsons, that we ask our solicitor to arrange a case with the Bell Telephone Company and place it before the Court to determine their legal right to use the Cayuga bridge.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Shaver, seconded by Mr. Pyle, that this Council do now adjourn until one o'clock.—Carried.
Moved by Mr. McQuillin, seconded by Mr. Smith, that the report of the Building committee be received and read.—Carried.

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:—

We, your Building committee, beg leave to report as follows:—
1. That your committee met in Dunnville on March 18th for the purpose of inspecting the House of Refuge and arrange for having the barn moved to a more convenient site and placed in proper repair.

2. That after a careful inspection of the House of Refuge your committee is well satisfied with the work being done by the contractor and also with the material that is being used in the building. The heating system has been installed, the floor nearly all put down, bedroom doors all on and the work began on the stairs.

3. That we recommend that the barn be moved from where it stands to a site due North of the House and that it be placed on a nine foot concrete wall, and that the tender of Mr. Smith to do all the work of moving for \$35.00 dollars be accepted.

4. We recommend that we do not build a septic tank or cesspool for the purpose of sewage disposal, but build a sewer to connect with the Dunnville system of sewers, as that plan would give much better satisfaction.

Moved by Mr. Cline, seconded by Mr. Walton, that a bill be introduced to appointed George P. Brown and wife as Master and Matron to take charge of the Haldimand House of Refuge which is located at Dunnville.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. McQuillin, seconded by Mr. Pyle, in amendment that Mr. James Waddle and wife be and is hereby appointed Manager and Matron for the house of Refuge.—Lost.

Moved by Mr. Shaver, seconded by Mr. Young, in amendment to the amendment that the application of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Schwalan, be accepted as Manager and Matron for the House of Refuge.—Lost.

Moved by Mr. Pyle, seconded by Mr. Shaver, that we do now adjourn to allow the different committees to meet.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Bain, that the report of the finance committee be received and read.—Carried.
