Canada's Best Year.

Ottawa, April 8.—The returns of revenue and expenditure of the Dominion received by the Finance Department up to the night of March 31st, and published in the regular monthly financial statement to-day, bear out the forecast made some days ago, that the total revenue for the fiscal year will, when all the returns are in, be over one hundred millions, and the surplus of revenue over all ordinary revenue will be close to the twenty million mark, both figures constituting a remarkable new record in the financial administration of the country.

Actual receipts returned to the Finance Department up to the end of the month totalled \$98,662,974. It is estimated that over two million dollars will still be received before the books for the year are finally closed, some two months hence, thus bringing the total revenue close to a hundred and one millions. This will be an increase of about sixteen million dollars as compared with the preceding fiscal year. The expenditure on consolidated fund account is expected to reach about eighty-one millions, a decrease of three millions as compared with 1908-1909, and a net betterment of nineteen millions.

Of the total increase in the revenue about thirteen million is due to customs.

The expenditure on capital account for the year, as shown by returns received up to the end of the month, has been \$31,461,686, of which some twenty millions was on account of the National Transcontinental Railway.

The total capital expenditure and special charges for the year, including railway subsidies and bounties, will probably be \$35,500,000. Exclusive of expenditure on the National Transcontinental Railway, Canada has paid during the past fiscal year out of revenue every item of expenditure on both capital and consolidated fund account with nearly five millions still to the good to apply to National Transcontinental Railway construction account.

The total net debt of the Dom. at the end of the month was \$325,876,712, a decrease during the month of \$2, 82,166.

Killed in Collision.

St. Thomas, April 10.—Thomas L. Jeffries, a brakeman, died in the hospital here on Saturday night, and Oscar S. Foss, engineer, is recovering from severe scalds received in a wreck on the M. C. R. at Waterford at midnight on Friday, when a merchandise freight crashed into the rear end of a dead freight. Seven cars were derailed, five of them demolished. The engine was

thrown across the opposite track on its side, and the escaping steam caused the injuries to the engineer and brakeman F. Maloney tried to escape over the coal tender and was buried in the coal, but escaped unhurt.

The damage to rolling stock will be about \$5,000. All the injured men were on the second train. The dead brakeman was twenty-five years old, unmarried, and lived in the city with his widowed mother. His sufferings before death were severe. An inquest has been ordered at the request of the deceased's mother. It is said Engineer Foss misunderstood signals, and ran past the brakeman sent out to flag the rear of the first train.
