Men Who Know.

"I find the keeping of individual cow records very useful indeed, and would not go back again to the guessing method," writes a farmer who has tried both ways. The men who just guess and who do not know what each cow in the herd gives during the year, often guess too much on the weight of milk and fat, and too little on the cost of feed. They guess that "Polly" is the best cow in the herd, but they do not know, because they have not weighed or tested the milk on any system. Probably "Buttercup" is far ahead of "Polly" as a producer.

The men who know the best cow in the herd, those who know which cows produce a large quantity at a low cost are the men who not only get good satisfaction out of keeping good cows, but they are the men who get good money when they sell, because they have records to augment the value. The men who know the poor cows by their records sell them off for beef and save time, and labour, and feed, and stable room, and bad language. The men who know enough to select good cows on their records of production are the successful dairymen today. The Dairy Division, Ottawa, supplies record forms for milk and feed so that men can soon know what profit each cow pays. The question is not "What does the herd average this month or next, but what does each cow give during the year? Each should be a "long distance" milkster.—Ottawa, July 1910.

Apple Diseases To Be Combated.

The three diseases, Black Rot, Canker and Leaf Spot, have been found to be due to a single fungus, *Sphaeria Molitorum*. The black rot of the apple is dark brown or black in color, and the affected tissue comparatively firm. It is thus readily distinguished from the soft rot. It may start on any part of the fruit, but often begins at the blossom and frequently follows insect stings. The disease is primarily a rot of ripe fruit, but it may often be found as dark brown spots one-eighth to one-half of an inch in diameter several weeks before the apples are mature. These spots may develop very slowly until about picking time, but after that spread rapidly to involve the whole apple. As the rot develops, numerous minute, black elevations may be seen on the apple. These are the spore producing bodies of the fungus and are known as pycnidia. The rot does considerable damage in cellar storage, but is especially common in the fruit left on the trees or ground. This worthless fruit becomes a great source of infection the following spring.

Canker is a term applied to rough, unsightly wounds that are known to be due to the action of fungi. The most common variety of this trouble is the "black rot canker," also known as the "New York apple tree canker." The disease is usually found on the larger limbs, but may attack the smaller ones and sometimes the trunk. In some cases it seems to cause merely a greater roughening of the bark, but where a broken twig or other injury furnishes an entrance to the actively growing tissue of the host, the effects are often much more pronounced. In serious cases the bark may be "killed" over considerable area and become conspicuously cracked and roughened. It is set off from the living bark by a very definite boundary. Limbs are often so nearly girdled that the parts beyond lie. Pycnidia similar to those on the fruit are found on the canker.

The leaf spot makes its appearance on the leaves shortly after they unfold from the bud. Infection continues throughout the spring, but notes taken the past year indicate that it ceases early in June. At first the spots are small, purple areas, but as growth progresses they become yellowish brown in color, and attain a diameter of from $\frac{1}{8}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch. They are

quite uniformly circular in outline. The margins are somewhat elevated, giving to the spot a sunken appearance. As the spots become older a secondary growth may spread from the central affected area producing a somewhat irregular blotch in which the outline of the original spot can always be recognized. It often happens that several of these areas become confluent, and thus the greater part of the leaf may become affected. Leaves so affected fall from the trees much earlier than under normal conditions, and their working efficiency is always greatly reduced by the middle of the summer. Trees so robbed of their foliage from year to year must eventually become greatly impaired in their vigor and finally succumb to a premature destruction.

Treatment.—The fact that the one fungus is responsible for three different forms of disease makes its destruction a matter of special importance and rather unusual difficulty. Spraying has been quite effective in controlling the leaf spot. Use Bordeaux mixture or lime-sulphur solution. At least three applications are necessary to control leaf spot. Spraying made at various times in the summer have had little or no effect upon the number of spots of rot on the fruit at picking time. The destruction of the affected fruit is apparently the only efficient treatment for this form of the disease. All cankered limbs should be cut and burned. Proper treatment of wounds and thorough spraying will decrease the number of cankers. Heavy applications made when the trees are in a dormant condition are probably especially efficacious.—Extract from bulletin, issued by New Hampshire experiment station.

Census Of Forest Products.

The census of the forest products of Canada, to be taken on 1st June, 1911, will embrace square, waney or flat timber, logs for lumber and miscellaneous products.

In the first class are included ash, birch, elm, maple, oak, pine and all other timber cut as square, waney or flat, and in the enumeration will be reported for cubic feet and value.

Logs for lumber, which are included in the second class, are in such woods as elm, hickory, hemlock, oak, pine and spruce. They will be enumerated in the census by quantities of 1,000 feet board measure, with value in the same unit.

Miscellaneous products of the forest include bark for tanning, fence posts, firewood, hoop, and hop poles, masts and spars, piling, pot and pearl ashes, railroad ties, staves, stove-bolts and heading, telegraph poles (including telephone and other poles for electric wires,) wood for pulp, and the furs and skins of forest animals undressed, and they will be enumerated by number of quantity and value.

The census of forest products will be taken chiefly from farmers and the lessees of timber limits.
