### Uses of Sawdust

Sawdust is generally regarded as an objectionable product because it increases the danger of fire if deposited near mills or lumber piles and necessitates either carting with a accompanying expense or the construction of a "burner" and the use of conveyors or carts to transfer it from the saws.

A double economy, however, is now in progress. As a result of the use of band saws instead of old circular and gang saws, a log than under the old system produced eight boards will now produce nine, a very substantial increase in product with a corresponding decrease in the amount of sawdust produced.

Owing to its chemical and mechanical properties, it has an ever increasing field of usefulness. Used as an absorbent for nitro-glycerine, it produces dynamite. Used with clay and burned, it produces a terra-cotta brick full of small cavities that, owing to its lightness and its properties as a non-conductor, makes excellent fire-proof material for partition walls. Treating it with fused caustic alkali produces ovalic acid. Treating it with sulphuric acid and fermenting the sugar so formed, produces alcohol. Mixed with a suitable binder and compressed, it can be used for mouldings and imitation carvings; while, if mixed with Portland cement, it produces a flooring material. It is an excellent packing material for fragile articles and for dangerous explosives and can be used as packing in wall to make them sound-proof and cold-proof.

### The Western Fair a Good Live Stock Exhibition.

Sept. 9th to 17th This Year.

The Western Fair, London, Ontario, as a Live Stock Exhibition, is becoming more popular each year. Breeders and Stockmen always report good results from exhibiting their animals at London. The classification for the different breeds of Live Stock is well arranged in the Prize List and the prizes offered are extra good this year. In addition to the cash prizes there are a number of good specials, one of which is a Silver Tea Service, value \$40.00 for the best Two-Year-Old Filly bred in Canada, given by "The Canadian Farm." This should bring out a good entry in this class. The cash prizes for the Cattle, Sheep and Swine are all increased this year and a large entry is expected. The rule withholding third prize when no competition was offered has been withdrawn, and all prizes may be awarded if the animals are worthy. Medals will be given in some sections in the Sheep Department. The Dog and Cat Show will again be a feature this year. Monday, September 12th, will be Athletic Day, when a popular programme of sports, including a Tag-of-War, will be put on. All information will be given on application to the Secretary, London, Ontario.
