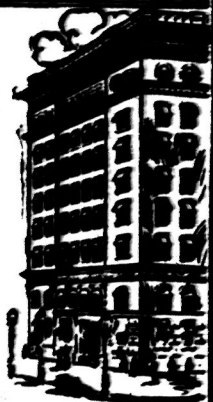

Cruelty to Animals.

In cities and towns, the humane society sees to it that no dumb animal is abused or treated with cruelty. In the country, the dumb animal has no such champion. He may not be needed, though occasionally one hears of animals in the country being cruelly treated or so neglected as to feed and care as to make existence a hardship. To the intelligent farmer, however, the dumb animal, whether it be a horse, a cow, a sheep or a pig, is an asset of which it pays him to take care of. Abuse of an animal touches his pocket-book, and consequently aside from humane considerations, the domestic animal on the farm receives decent treatment. Yet there may be here and there a farmer who does not give to his animals the treatment they deserve. A rather interesting case of this kind comes from Scotland. Two persons, the owner and the grazier, allowed their sheep to become badly infested with maggots, and were brought before the sheriff of the district for cruelty to animals. The charge was that they did cruelly ill-treat these sheep by failing to keep a sufficient watch over them to ascertain whether they were attacked by flies or maggots, as a result of which neglect on their part, these ewes were subjected to severe suffering, and three of them died. The charge was brought under the cruelty to animals act, and both were fined, the owner, £5 (\$25) with the option of twenty-one days imprisonment, and the grazier, £3 (\$21) with the option of fourteen days imprisonment. This case, so far as is known, is the first of the kind ever brought into court. It is not to be supposed that these parties wilfully allowed their sheep to become infested with maggots. But it was shown that they had neglected to give the sheep the care and attention that would have prevented any occurrence of this kind.
