Washington, Jan. 28. - More than \$90,000,000 worth of Americans were experted to Canada last year. That at least, is the effect of immigration from the United States to Canada in 1909, according to the report of the United States Consul Consut of Windsor, Out. The total number of emigrants from the United States for the year was 90,-148, and the Canadian Immigration Commissioner has estimated that the average wealth of these American settlers was \$1,000.

There are several reasons advanced by authorities for the large increase of immigration into Canadian territory," says Consul Conant. "but the one given the most credence is the easy manner in which homestead lands can be obtained, and the inducements held out to prospective settlers."
