Walpole Council.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment. All the members present. Keeve, J. J. Parsons in the chair.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and adopted.

Roulston - Holbrook. Resolved that the tender of The Jarvis Record to do the township printing for 1910 for the sum of one hundred dollars be accepted.—Carried.

Roulston - Holbrook, that the auditors' financial statement for 1909 be adopted as read, showing a balance on hand up to Dec. 31st, of cash in the Bank of Hamilton, Jarvis, \$1164.71, and uncollected taxes \$61.40. Total \$1226.11.—Carried.

Holbrook - Falls. Resolved that the clerk is hereby instructed to prepare a by-law to appoint William Gourley Webster of the town of Dunnville, Civil Engineer, to be Township Engineer of the Municipality of Walpole and the same be now read a first time.—Carried.

Roulston - Holbrook. Resolved that the By-law be now read a second time.—Carried.

Falls - Pond. Resolved that the By-law be now read a third time, passed, signed, numbered and entitled as in the original motion.—Carried.

Several accounts for shovelling snow and opening up roads were presented to the Council but after careful consideration it was decided to lay the accounts over until 1st April, so that all snow accounts would be in by that time, and in view of the snow question, Deputy Reeve Roulston had prepared a time sheet for overseers to keep an exact account of the expenses in shovelling snow and also damages caused by the public driving through private property. It met with the approval of the Council and the Clerk was requested to have it printed and distributed among all the overseers of Highways in the Township.

A B-law was passed appointing overseers of Highways whose duties will commence April 1st, and they will hold office until the following April. The present Road By-law was also criticized and several amendments were suggested one very important change was suggested to allow each Division in full amount of statute labor instead of two thirds. However the By-law was laid over until next meeting of the Council when it will be again taken up and revised.
