Sad Drowning Fatality.

On Friday afternoon last about three o'clock four boys went over to the third wastewear west of Supt. Rogers' residence to have a swim.

They had been enjoying themselves for some time when Harry Forrester, using a pair of water wings for protection, jumped off the pier. The wings came off, and when Harry did not come to the surface, George ran to Rodgers' and gave the alarm. Mr. Rodgers immediately phoned for a doctor. Five or six gentlemen went to the scene of the accident and dived for the body. Mr. Robt. Murdy succeeded in getting him in the sixth or seventh dive in the seventh valve of the wastewear, and brought him to shore. Dr. Kerr arrived on the scene and did everything he could to restore life, but the body had been in the water about half an hour and their efforts were in vain.

Harry was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. John Forrester of Dunnville, and was 15 years old on June 22nd last. He was born in Wainfleet. The family moved to Dunnville nine years ago, but for eight years of this time Harry attended the school for the deaf at Belleville.

The funeral took place on Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Service was conducted at the home, by Rev. Mr. Emerson of Brantford, a former visiting clergyman to the school at Belleville. The remains were interred in the Riverside Cemetery.—Dunnville Chronicle.
