#### Settlers For Alberta.

Calgary, July 16. - Mr. F. W. Brown, Publicity Commissioner for ta, arriving in Calgary to-day, says: "I left Toronto on Tuesday with a special of ten cars, carrying three hundred Ontario settlers destimed for Alberta points. Twentyfive are business men who will open stores in new towns. Others are sons of wealthy Ontario farmers, and the majority will buy land and immediately commence devolpment. Nothing can stop the movement from Untario to Alberta. The influx is the result of the aggressive Provincal publicity campaign."

#### Census of Agriculture.

The area, product and value of wheat, barley, oats, rye, corn for friends in South Bend, Ind. husking, buckwheat, beans, peas flax, mixed grains, hay and clover, alfalfa or lucerne, corn for forage, other forage crops, turnips, mangolds, sugar beets, other field roots, tobacco and hope; and grass product and value.

Grain and other field crops for the harvest of 1911 will be taken by areas only, as none of these crops crops will be gathered later in the vear from the reports of correspondeuts.

Animals and animal products, also under the head of agriculture, will include the number of horses three years old and over, hors s under three years, mileh cows, other horned or neat cattle, sheep, day last. swine, turkeys, geose, ducks, hens and chickens and hives of bees held or owned by each person at the date of the census on lat day of

June of 1911. The number of horses, milch cows, other horned or nest cattle, sheep, swine, and poultry sold in 1910, will be recorded, as well as the wool, milk, home-made butter. products of the year, and the quartities of milk and cream sent to

factory or sold. with all other animals.
