Feed and Care Main Thing in Poultry Raising.

By J. W. MORROW, WATERFORD, ONT.
I have been interested more or less in the care of poultry for nearly half a century and have in these years made some observations respecting their care. I have tried about all of the popular breeds and varieties in the hope of finding the best breed but I have become fully convinced that there is much more in the care given to them for profitable returns than there is in the breed. At times I have kept several varieties which was attended with much inconvenience in keeping them in separate pens and then the motley mixture after the hatching season was over destroyed the beauty of the flock. (For what is nicer in a pen of poultry than to see them all uniform in color and of a standard quality.)

During the last few years I have settled down to one variety—the old familiar Barred Rocks—first I found the usual objection to them that they were inclined too much to take on fat and were too broody. But that was more my fault than theirs in not knowing how to treat them for the best results. They are a variety that need to be made to "scratch for a living." I therefore scatter their feed where they have to work to get it and in doing so it gives them vigor and keeps them from becoming too fat and also from becoming too much disposed to set. My difficulty is to get them to set early but I find no difficulty in breaking up those that I do not want to hatch.

I give them plenty of fresh air and pure water and keep them as near to nature in their feed as I can in summer and winter. I am no longer troubled with sickness among them but find them healthy and strong. I have also respect to their food as to what I feed them as well as to how I feed them. I find that a mixture of feed is best, such as oats, wheat, buckwheat and corn, with an occasional feed of ground barley and bran mixed, and given to them dry. I try to keep plenty of gravel or grit, with a liberal supply of oyster shells before them. It is of first importance that their house and pen be kept dry and free from vermin.

I give them, in the summer time when confined, the rakings from my lawn which they relish much, and in the winter I try to remember them with green cabbage or sugar beets.

I have been breeding Rocks for size and have got my hens to weigh nine and ten pounds and the cock birds to weigh twelve and thirteen pounds or more, but I am now breeding them weighing two and three pounds less and like them better. I have respect more to the quality than to the size and try and breed from the best laying strains and I think that I can challenge competition (all things considered) with any of the breeds.
