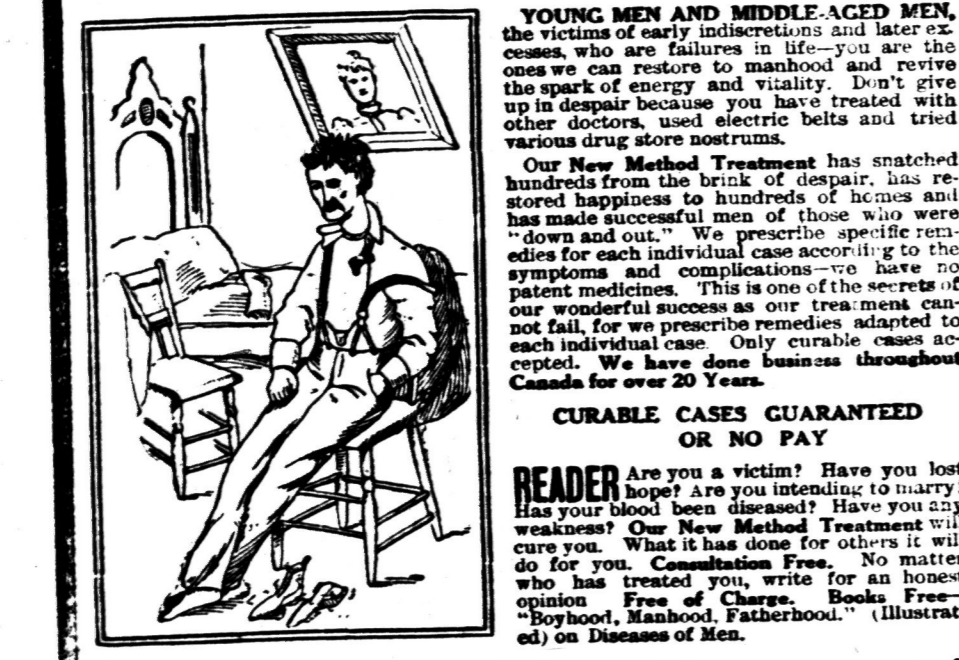

Manitoba's Legislative buildings will be reconstructed at a cost of \$400,000. The French flood loss in eighteen departments is officially placed at \$14,000,000. Natural gas has been struck under Lake Erie, about a mile a mile out from Selkirk.

Haldimand Resources.

Of the three chief natural gas producing fields in Ontario, Haldimand county's output, 54 per cent., was valued at \$635,185 for 1908. This county which leads, was \$191,622 ahead of Welland field which produced 34.8 per cent. Prospects point to a further increase. Principal producers in the Haldimand field are the Dominion Natural Gas Co., of Pittsburg, Pa., Producers' Natural Gas Co., of Hamilton, and the Selkirk Gas and Oil Co., of Selkirk. New wells drilled in three fields—Haldimand, Welland and Norfolk—last year numbered 77; Haldimand 38, Welland 25, and Norfolk 16.

The Caledonia Gypsum Co.'s mine, about to be developed at Caledonia, is said to contain over 3,000,000 tons of gypsum on 100 acres. 10,389 tons of gypsum was mined in Ontario in 1909, an increase of 1,128 tons over that of 1907, and valued at \$20,778.
