Fencing—Would recommend not to build any new fence this year, but to repair the old fence, as committee see fit, that is in regard to pasture field and outside fences. We have ten acres plowed for peas at present, and intend sowing the same field with fall wheat and seeding with grass seed. We have hired a team to assist in the work, as there is more work than the county team can do in preparing land for beans and corn, in order to get crop in time for factory. And that the committee be empowered to buy manure or any other fertilizer that they may think necessary for roots or vegetables.

The report of the Home committee of the House of Refuge was adopted as follows:

To the Warden and County Council:

We made contract with canning factory for 1910—10 acres of pears at \$22.50 per ton delivered at factory, or \$20.00 and delivered by factory, 10 acres of beans at one cent per lb. delivered, the beans to be picked by hands of the factory and weighed in field. 6 acres of sweet corn at \$7.00 per ton delivered, all grain and seeds to be furnished by the factory. Would recommend that the county purchase some fertilizer, especially for the six acres of corn, as the land is in very poor state. It requires about 200 or 300 lbs. to the acre at \$28.00 per ton. The balance of crop—seven acres of field corn for home use, eight acres for roots, berries, and two acres of fodder corn to feed cows through the summer, and also fit this ground for orchard and small fruits, and bal-
