April 21, 1910.
Council met at the call of the warden, pursuant to adjournment.
All the members except Messrs. Robertson, Walton and Secord were present.
The following communications were read:
March 22nd—From John H. Davidson.
April 8th—From Minister of Education.

MINUTES OF SUPPLY COMMITTEE

Pyle—Robertson—that Mr. Smith act as secretary. Carried.
Members present—Roulston, Pyle, Shaver, Anderson, Robertson and Smith.
It was decided that a kitchen cabinet of standard make be purchased for use at the House of Refuge.
The rest of the supplies were selected according to the following list, and tenders to submit out of articles in each case where practicable. Committee reserve the right to inspect goods before shipment. Tenders will be received for the whole or any part separately. Sealed tenders to be received until 6 o'clock p.m. on May 6th, 1910.

Mr. Pyle and the Clerk are to procure the necessary books for the office of the House of Refuge, a visitors' book 18x24, day register, day book for records of inmates and ordinary day book. Mr. Pyle is to get information regarding the electric light, to be ready in case anything going wrong with the gas lights. Letter from Dunville Light Co., accompanies this. Shaver—Smith—that Mr. Pyle be authorized to purchase a combined grain and fertilizer drill for use immediately on the Home farm. Committee adjourned to meet on May 9th at 10 o'clock a.m. so open tenders.

Henry Pyle, Reeve of Dunville:
Dear Sir,—In reply to your inquiry as to terms on which the Dunville Electric Light Company will supply electric lights to the House of Refuge, would say the Co. will run a line and connect the House up with their line, and furnish electricity at six cents per thousand watts, the Light Co. furnishing wire, cross arms, transformer

- 1—Eight Day Clock, with striker, 12 inch dial in case about 18x27 inches, quartered oak, brass movement.
- 2—One Large Range, with double oven and hot air closets, to burn coal or gas, also a 40 gallon tank, with gas burner underneath, and taps and pipe complete. The range shall set on a zinc extending 2 feet beyond the range on every side. The range shall be set up ready to burn gas, such stove pipes as shall be requisite to be supplied. About nine feet of stove pipe will be required.
- 3—3 Steel Pots of 3 gallons each.

- 5—2 Granite Tea Pots of 2 gallons each.

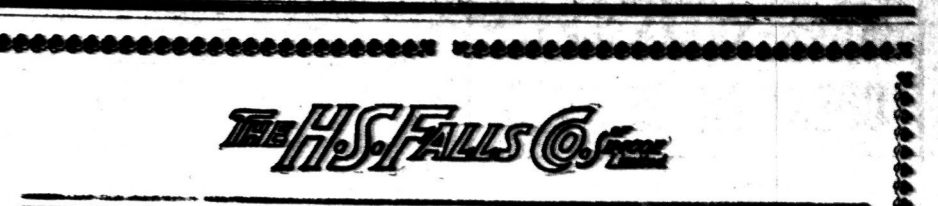
To the Warden and County Council:

Gentlemen,—On the 31st of March last your committee met at the House of Refuge in Dunville. We had previously advertised for teams suitable for the county farm, and for sale, to meet us there. Eight teams were present. We purchased a team of mares from Stephen Zimmerman for \$340. Mr. Pyle was instructed to have a veterinary surgeon examine them. The latter's certificate, which states they are sound and four years old, accompanies this report.
We also opened tenders for farm implements which had been asked for, and purchased from H. J. Hall, salesman for the International Harvester Company, Hamilton, Ont.:
