Consolidated Oil Fields.

Vancouver, May 20.—The Con-
 solidated Oil Fields of California,
 Limited, an English Syndicate, with
 offices at Albion House, 61 Oxford
 Street, London, has purchased the
 entire holdings of the Ramona and
 Bonita Oil Companies California,
 and intend developing the entire
 holdings of these Companies on a
 large scale, and to commence drill-
 ing at once.

It is learned on consulting com-
 mercial authorities that the new
 Company is the off-spring of one of
 England's foremost corporations,
 to-wit: The International Lands
 & Industry Company, Ltd., of Lon-
 don, England, which is heavily cap-
 italized.

The news was made public in the
 San Francisco papers several days
 ago that British capital is investing
 heavily in the California Oil Fields,
 and the fact that over \$20,000,000
 of English coin was invested there.

The absorption of the greater por-
 tion of the dividend-paying petro-
 leum plants of this state, by finan-
 cially strong managers, and the pros-
 pect that the system of marketing
 and producing will be carried on
 along conservative lines, will lend
 stability to the oil business, and
 will, to a great extent, place it
 among industrial rather than specu-
 lative enterprises.

The Californians who have be-
 come enriched by this accession of
 foreign capital, will invest their
 profits in new petroleum fields to
 develop thoroughly the past area of
 the oil deposits along the coast
 ranges.

Destroyed By Tornado.

Paul's Valley, Okla., May 20.—
 Maysville, a small town fifteen miles
 northwest of here, was wiped off the
 map by a tornado early this evening
 and several persons were killed, ac-
 cording to meagre reports received
 here to-night.

The town of McCarty, near Mays-
 ville, was nearly all swept away, and
 three persons were killed. All wires
 are down. Relief parties probably
 will be sent out to-night. One of
 the heaviest hailstorms in the history
 of this region swept over a stretch
 of country near here this evening,
 in places obliterating all signs of vege-
 tation.

Feared A Fiery Death.

Santa Ana, Cal., May 21.—Mrs.
 Voila Fastenum yesterday gave her
 two children concentrated lye and
 drank some herself, and all three
 are at the point of death. Mrs.
 Fastenum said the comet was sure
 to strike the earth, and she wanted
 her children to escape a fiery death.
 Berlin, May 19.—The German

balloon Abercorn was the only one
 among a large number making as-
 censions in Germany which succeed-
 ed in getting Observations of the
 comet. The aeronauts report that
 they reached an altitude of 11,385
 feet. They noted extraordinarily
 brilliant horizontal lights like met-
 eors. They secured four bottles of
 air at that height, which will under-
 go expert examination for meteoric
 dust and other ingredients. They
 were compelled to descend owing to
 an electrical storm.
