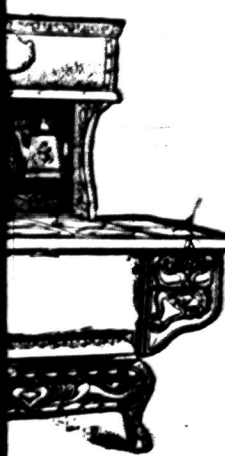

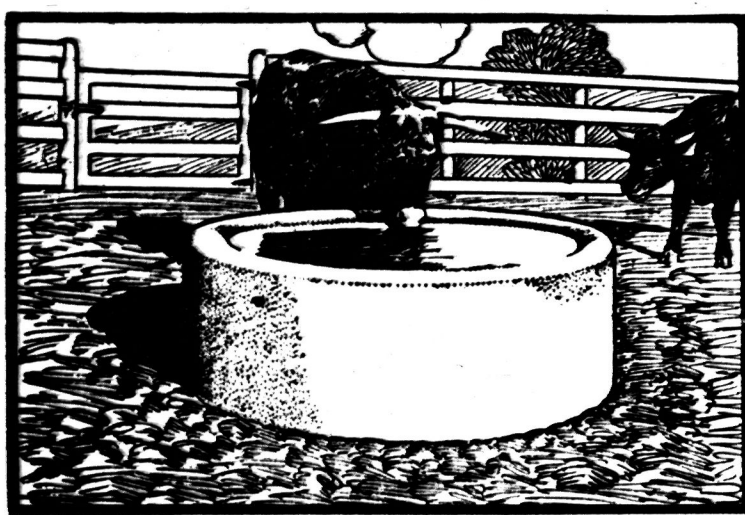

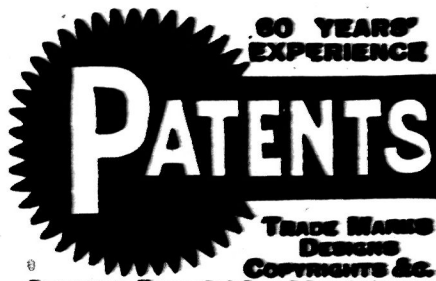

School Saving Bank in Simcoe

With the consent and co-operation of the Board of Education, the Molsons Bank has established a savings branch in the public schools of the town of Simcoe. Each pupil is supplied with a small pass book, and the deposit ledger is kept by the principal of the school. The bank keeps a special school saving amount and sends a messenger to the school for the money once a week, and the accounts are regularly audited. Sums of five cents or any multiple thereof may be deposited. The system is similar to that adopted by the Bank of British North America in the Hamilton public schools and is working perfectly. It was installed in the Simcoe schools three weeks before the summer holidays of 1909, and during the three weeks the deposits amounted to \$75. The amounts have been quite spontaneous, and in April 1910, the amount showed a balance of between \$400 and \$500 to the credit of the children.
