### Listening on Telephones

An invention has been completed for what many people thought impossible, namely, an indicator to reveal the number of phone on the line where the receiver is taken down while a conversation is taking place. Subscribers to rural phones know that on a line there are usually one or two people who are always interested in other people's business and frequently their presence may be known by the click of the receiver as it is taken from the holder. This invention will not only indicate when a third party comes on the line but also when they go off. The contrivance is not a complicated affair but can be manufactured at a very reasonable figure and can be easily attached to any telephone. The inventor of this very useful apparatus which we believe is destined to revolutionize the telephone system in Canada and the United States where new lines are being built daily are Eugene Bros., of Linwood, Ont., who have applied for a patent for their invention.

### Cider Vinegar

November is the month when good cider can be made. There is economy in making good cider vinegar if you know how to make it well, and money in it, if you care to sell it. Consumers in the city will pay a good price for cider vinegar, if they know it to be both genuine and good. To do this only clean, whole apples should be selected. There are too many who ought to know better, making cider from apples that are selected only by the process of scooping them up with a shovel. A clean wood barrel, and a temperature steadily between 70 and 77 degrees are the requisites for bringing cider into good clear vinegar safely and surely. There is a quicker process by which the barrels are hung up from the sides, so that they can be inverted readily, the barrel being filled with beechwood shavings, remained in the sides and ready half filled with cider. This makes a very quick and good process, but the barrels must be covered every eight hours or the shavings will dry. This place is best where anyone wishes to manufacture a lot of vinegar for sale, but where only a moderate quantity is desired, a good clean oak barrel, especially one in which vinegar has been kept before, will make an equally good quality of vinegar if allowed to stand while fermentation proceeds.

### About Stray Cattle

This is the time of the year that cattle wander off and a publication of the laws regarding stray cattle would not be amiss. The law of Ontario on this matter are very definite. In cases where cattle run at large and wander onto the premises of one who is not their owner, there are two courses to pursue. So soon as an animal is found on a man's premises he may drive it to the pound and notify the clerk of the municipality, which will attend to its release or disposition, or he may secure it on his premises and retain it while he is complying with statutory requirements which are these: he must first publish a notice of the presence of such beast on his property in a newspaper issued in his locality and keep the same running for three consecutive weeks. If the owner fails to claim the animal its custodian must keep it for two months, and if the value exceeds \$20 it must be sold and after all expenses of harboring and sale which must not exceed \$20, have been deducted, the balance must be handed to the treasurer of the municipality in case the lawful owner of the animal has not in the meantime been found. If the value of the animal is below \$20 it becomes the property of the man on whose premises it strayed after he had properly advertised its presence. When an animal is claimed expenses of pasture and feeding are determined, the law makes provision against exorbitant charges. Any person harboring animals which are not his own and does not advertise their presence is liable to prosecution, when a heavy fine may be imposed by the justice of the peace.

### End of a Saintly Partnership

Unfeigned regret reigns throughout Canada over the news that the partnership which existed for 25 years between Messrs. Crossley and Hunter, evangelists, has had to be dissolved through the physical disability of Mr. Hunter.  
The names and evangelistic work of Crossley and Hunter are as famous in Canada as were those of Moody and Sankey in the United States. Rev. Mr. Hunter has fallen a victim to palsy, as the result of long-continued arduous toiling in the cause of Christianity.  
For more than a quarter of a century Mr. Hunter labored incessantly in a work which made a terrific drain on his nervous energy. He never spared himself, and while this indubitably contributed largely to the success of Crossley and Hunter meetings, seemingly it has compelled Mr. Hunter to retire from any further participation in his well-loved work. While this news awakens general regret, all who knew Mr. Hunter and took an interest in the cause of evangelism, ardently hope that his disability will prove only temporary, and that he will soon rejoin his partner.  
The Christian Guardian, in its current issue, expresses regret that Divine Providence has at last parted these two faithful and distinguished men. The grateful tributes of the Guardian will find a responsive note of sympathy wherever the works of Crossley and Hunter are known.
