

### AMONG THE JEWS

In addition to the frequent destructive fires in several towns and townships, the number of which has just been augmented by a great conflagration at Radomskovi, Jewish communal life in the Pale seems to suffer greatly from the extensive emigration movement in many districts.

An important announcement has just been made by the Turkish Minister of Public Works. There has been a large increase in the Jewish population of both the Argentine colonies, and also those in Brazil and Canada.

The aims of the institute are to revive ancient Hebrew music, to train cantors to collect the songs and traditions of the Jewish race, to form a collection of Jewish musical instruments and a library of Jewish music, and poetry.

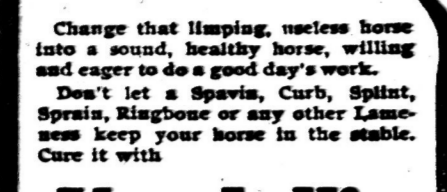
