How To Recognize Mushrooms.

Never gather or eat fungi that grow in woods or that have white gills. Avoid all those that you cannot positively identify as the common or edible mushroom that is known to scientists as *Agaricus campestris*. In all parts of the world in which this fungi grows, it is known and used as food. If it's characteristic and habit are memorized there is little danger of its being confused with the poisonous growths. Its stalk is from two to six inches in height and never more than an inch in diameter. On the upper end of the stalk is an umbrella-shaped cap, the color and thickness which varies. The cap may be white or cream color or running the gamut of shades down to a deep brown. The stem is usually a cream tint and has near the cap a ring of material sometimes called the annulus, which forms a protection for the under surface of the cap. On this under surface are the gills or lamellae. In the early stages of the growth of the mushroom these gills are pink later they turn brown or even brownish black. The agruous or variable grows in open fields and meadows. It is never found in woods or shaded places. If the casual visitor to the country will remember this, he can eliminate ninety per cent of this danger. From Physical Culture for August.

News Notes of Western Canada.

Winnipeg, Man., Aug. 26, 1911.—The crop is still the big thing in the west, and a very big thing it will surely be. The longest for hot weather came and not to late, as some feared it would. After a season on which brought a little to much rain in some parts, the crop is being finished off with weather so splendidly clear and warm that fields that were green before have ripened and are being cut fast. A feature of the crop is the earliness of ripening in Manitoba. Many fields about Winnipeg have been cut a week or ten days and the harvest is making rapid progress on all hands. Reports of yields from the several districts bear out the forecast of 200,000,000 bushels of wheat made by experienced men some weeks ago. Oats, Barley and flax are also due to make records and there has never been a better year for field crops.

Market gardeners have done especially well around about Winnipeg this year. There was a general scarcity of potatoes and the season has been a most favorable one for this crop. The fields were planted early and most of them have done well. Early potatoes were dug the fifteenth of July, and a gardener sold 178 bushels from three-quarters of an acre of land, at three dollars a bushel. This was no exception but the rule with all potatoes planted on early land. Another gardener sold \$547.40 worth of cabbages from half an acre and had his crop off by the 1st August. Prices for all fresh vegetables rule high in the Winnipeg market, and there is good demand for all the truck raised.

The splendid crop outlook has attracted much notice from the tourists through the west and notice of a most practical nature in many cases. Railroad men have been notably at-
